

Sometimes, you can see them. It may be a family who are new to the community moving into a house at the end of a street. It could be the man you see walking into Lima every day, his feet dragging as he makes his way back home to Elida every evening. It could be the kids walking in the alley with nothing to occupy their time except whatever mischief they can find in the moment.

More often, you don't see them. They're elderly who live behind closed curtains and locked doors out of fear. Let me know what you think, or stop someone on our Administrative Council and share your ideas. God is calling us to active faith. Are we listening?





Problems with the lighting were repaired and all of the electrical work in the basement is complete. Doors were trimmed to allow clearance for the new flooring. New carpeting was installed in the East entry, elevette and Sacristry.





TO EMMAUS AND BEYOND

The story of Jesus meeting two disciples on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-35) appears in the lectionary for April 6. The story occurs on the afternoon of Easter Sunday. Jesus joins two disciples en route to the village of Emmaus, but they do not recognize who he is.

When the supposed stranger asks what the two are discussing, their jaws drop. "You've got to be the only person in Jerusalem who hasn't heard the news! A great prophet names Jesus was crucified. Some of our friends claim to have seen him alive, which would be wonderful, but that doesn't seem very likely."

For the remainder of the journey, Jesus explains the scriptures to these two, assuring them that the Messiah is indeed risen, and present.

Arriving at their destination, the disciples urge their companion to stay for dinner and during the meal Jesus takes bread, blesses it, and breaks it. "Then their eyes were opened, and they recognized him; and he vanished from their sight" (Luke 24:31, NRSV).

Many people take this story literally, seeing in it one of the many appearances of the risen Christ. Others look at it differently, seeing this story as a metaphor for Christ's presence in the church, then and now.

There are times when we feel helpless and hopeless, perhaps feeling abandoned by God, and unsure of our direction. At those times, in Christian community, we experience the presence of Christ with us, painstakingly helping us understand some truth that will move us beyond our present state.

In his book Jesus: A Revolutionary Biography, scholar John Dominic Crossan states: "Emmaus never happened; Emmaus always happens." Whatever our understanding, the story of Emmaus can remind us that we are not alone. Jesus Christ is with us. Always. To the end of the age.




Greetings in Christ from The Church @ Allentown,





This paraphrase of **Psalm 23** is written from the points of view of an older person, reflecting on a long, full life. The first line of verse 6 is adapted from "A New Creed" of the United Church of Canada.

¹God has walked with me; I could ask nothing more. ²God has given me green meadows to laugh in, clear streams to think beside, untrodden paths to explore. ³When I thought the world rested on my shoulders, God put things into perspective. When I lashed out at an unfair world, God calmed me down.

When I drifted into harmful ways, God straightened me out. God was with me all the way. ⁴I do not know what lies ahead. but I am not afraid. I know you will be with me. Even in death, I will not despair. You will comfort and support me. ⁵Though my eye dims and my mind dulls, you will continue to care about me. Your touch will soothe the tension in my temples; my fears will fade away. I am content. ⁶In life, in death, in life beyond

death, God is with me. All through life, I have found goodness in people. When life ends, I expect to be gathered into the ultimate goodness of God.
