

Dear Friends,

According to Luke, after Jesus had finished praying in a certain place, his disciples asked him to teach them to pray. He answered with the Lord's Prayer. How do you pray? How often? For what? Lately, I've been spending some time on my prayer life. I have been trying to do more listening to God, to hear what God might be speaking through my thoughts; and to reflect upon what God might be saying to me through others I encounter each day. Because of spending time on my own prayer life, I have become more aware of when others are praying. I've even felt the power of prayer from others, when my family went through some challenges, and even on Sunday mornings as I lead in worship.

I firmly believe in the old saying, "The family that prays together stays together." And, I believe that we need to expand that to "The church that prays together stays together." A praying church can do much that seems impossible to our ways of thinking.

In ReFocus, our Network went over the need for identified

"intercessors" among us to pray specifically for particular things among us.

- **General** intercessors keep the prayer list for the whole church, and pray on behalf of those in need. Lavonne Segovia does a

wonderful job of this level of

prayer in the church.

- Personal intercessors gather to pray for specific situations and people. These might be used for vigils during stewardship campaigns, during special events, or for a mission group. These would also pray for the pastor and leadership of the church.

- **Crisis** intercessors are a small group who are called together in times of crises, who will organize open prayer vigils for times of national or church crisis.

All of these kinds of intercessions are necessary in the life of the church. It is my goal to







MISSIONS COMMITTEE COMMENTARY


The St. Paul's Mission Committee has met once a month during January-March, incl., to discuss, evaluate, and act upon items of mission for our church.

One remarkable change that must be publicized is our Communion Sunday 'coins' designations. Because we've realized our potential cash contribution to the United Methodist Childrens' Home for 2009 will be very small, Coins for Communion (all loose change and currency) will be designated for contribution to the childrens' home during March, April, May, and June. Previously we had designated all 'coins' contributions be given to 'One Great Hour of Sharing' (as advertized in the March 1 Sunday bulletin), 'Native American Awareness', and 'Peace with Justice' during March, April, and June. We will still donate to these worthy causes but only with contributions made in the special envelopes so designated for those charities.

Planning work is in progress for this summer's mission trip to Worthington, Ohio the week of July 13, 2009, for another installment of United Methodist Childrens' Home construction and fix-it projects. Look for our sign-up poster or see Jamie Wyant to register. Similar to last year, our worker's pledge is \$100 per person or \$150 per couple. Most, if not all, of this pledge money goes to the Home or to our host church for lodging or meal expenses. On April 19, 2009, Rev. Steve Putka of the UMCH will be our guest speaker during service with a fund raiser luncheon to follow after the service.

Celebrating...

Picturing Easter

Leonardo da Vinci's painting *The Last Supper* is one of the most familiar pieces of art in the world. The original is huge (15 feet by 29 feet or 4.5 meters by 8.9 meters) and is painted on the dining room wall of a convent in Milan, Italy. Images of the painting also appear in many art books, tapestries, china, worship bulletins, and it has even been reproduced as a wax sculpture.

The painting shows Jesus and the disciples at the last supper right at the moment when Jesus has said, "One of you will betray me." Many people believe that this is an image of what it was actually like, but in fact Leonardo da Vinci shows Jesus and the disciples in a contemporary setting in an Italian villa. Perhaps he wanted people to imagine Jesus present with them as they were dining.

Many artists have created paintings, sculpture, and other works of art to depict scenes from Holy Week and Easter. In this season, find some of these and explore what they say. If you live near an art museum, go and see artwork that is there. Perhaps you have some books of art at home or at church you can look through. There are also

thousands of pieces of art visible through the Internet. Doing a search using words like "Holy Week art," "Palm Sunday art," "last supper art," "Good Friday art" or "Easter art" should yield many results. You might also think of other words to use in a search.

When you find art for this season, here are some questions you might use to guide your exploration:

- What does this artwork show?
- What might the artist be saying, or wanting to emphasize?
- What mood does the art inspire?
- How has the artist used things such as color, texture, or perspective to get their message across?

Try looking for art that connects with these themes, for the weeks of April:

ReFocus Update

The ReFocus Network of pastors continues to meet monthly in our Fellowship Hall. We are coming to the end of our first six months of intensive sessions. We held our Focused Leader's Retreat in Mt. Cory, OH this last month, and 37 people attended, including the four from St. Paul's. After some follow-up meetings to finish the work and do some planning, these four will begin to help Pastor Ruth lead members of the congregation through the Focused Living Retreat.

The Focused Living Retreat helps you look back on your life, the good and the bad, and find those times God has been actively involved in shaping you to become who you presently are. You then begin to look forward to discover who God is calling you to be in the future, and what God is calling you to do. This process of self discovery will hopefully give you an increased awareness of God's presence in your life.

Once a number of people have had the opportunity to participate in the Focused Living Retreat, and attend the optional follow-up meetings, we will be ready to begin to address the church's ministry through Focused Ministry Summits, and develop strategic plan that addresses where we believe God is calling this congregation into ministry in our community and the world. The Network Pastors will begin to meet again as our church members complete the Focused Living Retreats, and will begin the planning for Focused Ministry.

Be watching for your opportunities to sign up for a Focused Living Retreat beginning this summer. We hope to offer several dates that will allow as many of you as possible to participate.


A teacher asked children about their parents. One child said, "My mother's Catholic and my father is Jewish."
