

Dear Friends,

By now most of you have received and read the letter that I sent out letting you know that there will be a change in pastors here at St. Paul's. Let me reassure you that the change will not be until the end of June this year, as far as I or the PPRC know at this time. In the mean time, we have some things we want to do.

This year, we are moving forward with the two Initiatives that came out of our ReFocusing journey:

First, Linda Holman, with the help of the Nurture Committee and some others who are interested, are providing a monthly Seniors Day Out, which is growing each month. As this Initiative grows, the hope is that people from the community will be invited in to share in table fellowship and activities. As this ministry grows, more people will be needed to help prepare and order it. Let Linda know if you are interested in making a difference in the lives of the senior citizens of St. Paul's and Elida.

The second of the Initiatives, the Elida Area Community Center, is moving forward as the 501c-3 non-profit status has been filed. With that filing, the Board of Advisors will be able to receive donations so that the building that once housed the IGA store on Sunnydale Street can be purchased and renovated for youth and seniors, as well as programs for families. If you have questions or would like to help with this initiative, please let me, Dan Best, or Art Holman know. Donations are still needed, and help will be needed in the (hopefully) near future to begin renovation of the building.

Besides the Initiatives, there are mission activities planned, small groups that are reaching out, with more being planned, and worship continues to be exciting and Spirit filled. St. Paul's does not stand looking up when change happens. We continue to be in ministry.

In the next five months that we have together, my prayer is that we will continue to be Christ's presence in Elida and our greater community, and that you will be excited about the possibilities that lie ahead for St. Paul's UMC.



#### 2011 STEWARDSHIP COMMITTEE END OF YEAR REPORT

January 9, 2012

The Stewardship Committee at St. Paul United Methodist church had a busy year in 2011. We asked the congregation to participate in a Spiritual Gifts Survey in February. In October the committee initiated a new financial awareness program for Consecration Sunday. Throughout the whole year we tracked membership and reached out to those in our congregation that were not attending church for various reasons.

#### Spiritual Gifts Sunday – February 27<sup>th</sup>:

February 27, 2011, was "Spiritual Gifts Sunday". Pastor Ruth Solo delivered a message, which was outlined on a PowerPoint presentation about how each of us has been blessed with Spiritual Gifts. She explained that we just need to tune into which Spiritual Gifts we each possess and ask God how to use those Spiritual Gifts. Spiritual Gift Cards were passed out to the congregation, who was asked to fill in the question, "I will use my Spiritual Gifts of \_\_?\_\_ to serve my church in \_\_?\_" and to fill in the blanks for the three separate Spiritual Gifts that we each possess. The information from these cards will help church leaders figure out how best to fill out our committees and to help people realize how they best may serve God by serving our church.

<u>Consecration Sunday – October 30<sup>th</sup>, "Enough – Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity"</u>

In October the Stewardship Committee presented a Consecration Sunday Program entitled, "Enough – Discovering Joy Through Simplicity and Generosity." Pastor Ruth delivered successive messages over several Sundays based on the DVD series by Adam Hamilton of the same name. Pastor Ruth also taught on Sundays a group study session based upon the Hamilton series, which was open to anyone in the congregation wishing to learn more about how to manage their finances more wisely and for God's glory. Lavonne Segovia and Bill McKinney gave talks on successive Sundays about how God has led them to be wise in their financial decisions. The consecration program culminated with a Consecration Sunday in which everyone in the congregation was asked to make a financial pledge for the 2012 year to support the ministries and missions of St. Paul United Methodist Church. There were 48 pledges totaling \$ 132,708.00 for the 2012 Unified Budget.

#### **Outreach to Our Parishioners**;

Lavonne and Rudy Segovia collected attendance sheets each Sunday in 2011 from the red pew pads. Then Lavonne filled in her tracking spreadsheet to keep track of those parishioners in our congregation and identify those that missed 3 or more successive Sundays. When those persons were identified, Tim and Corinne Piper sent a copy of the bulletin each Sunday along with a "We Missed You" card to let our parishioners know that we care about them and asking them if they needed our assistance. Pastor Ruth did follow-up visits or phone calls to the individuals to determine if they needed prayers or encouragement for various reasons.







# ST. PAUL'S MISSIONS ACTIVITIES AND COMMITTEE WORK YEAR-END 2011

Mission work is one of the leading means for a congregation to connect with and minister to their neighbors, their community, and, ultimately – the world. Mission is also an effective means for attracting new members and for re-energizing existing members. The St. Paul's Missions Committee holds as its Mission Statement:

'We are called to be of service to others in the name of Christ Jesus and, therefore, we shall offer our time, talent, and offerings as our commitment to mission at St. Paul's Church'

St. Paul's 2011 Mission Committee work was different than in years prior: (i) ReFocus initiatives took effect and re-shaped Committee priorities; (ii) changes in the administration and operations at the Worthington-Ohio based United Methodist Children's Home cancelled our traditional summer work week. Regardless, there was much spirited missions activity throughout the year involving both familiar and new mission efforts. Thanks to Committee members **Dennis & Shara Bowsher**, **Virginia Hollar**, **Tim Piper**, **Greg Schade**, **Pastor Ruth Solo**, **Slone Whetstone**, and **Jamie Wyant**, for their time and contributions toward St. Paul's mission work during 2011. **Co-Chairs Marty White and Maedene Holmes** turn over Committee leadership to **Tim Piper** in 2012. Thus far, **Tim's** Committee is a bit thin going forward so if mission work is a passion or curiosity for you, contact **Tim or Pastor Ruth** for ways in which you can assist the St. Paul's Missions Committee.

#### St. Paul's congregation and Missions Committee efforts during 2011:

- Led by **Tim Piper**, St. Paul's hosted the February and September meetings of the Lima Area Methodist Men's group (L.A.M.M.);
- **Tim and Corinne Piper** also continue to lead St. Paul's contributions to and assistance with Family Promise at Immanuel U.M.C. and with our congregation's monthly donations to the Allentown U.M.C.'s 5 Loaves Food Pantry;
- **Slone Whetstone** is the St. Paul's liaison to the Elida-based Meals 'til Monday mission. She arranged for the organization's directors to give a brief presentation during a March service;
- **Jamie Wyant** continues to lead St. Paul's congregation in the construction of residential handicap ramps as part of its 'Ramps 'n Roofs' mission. On occasion, St. Paul's also provides the financing for a particular ramp. During 2011, St. Paul's constructed three Lima-area ramps and one very large ramp right across the street from our church;
- St. Paul's continues to serve the needy at the Central Ave., Lima Our Daily Bread Soup Kitchen every fifth Friday of the month or approximately 4-5 times per year. Bill McKinney, Carole & Denny Grapner (twice), Larry & Shirley Moser (twice), Don & Mary Irvin, Kathy & Marty White represented St. Paul's during the four 2011 dates;
- Maedene Holmes, Ruth Hardy, Pastor Ruth and Rich Solo organized 34 school kits and 12 health kits donated by our congregation as part of this annual October mission effort for our District's Festival of Sharing;
- Small group **Crafty Creatures** continues to bless our congregation and our community with their work of prayer shawls, blankets, and quilts. They also made significant contributions to our annual Mission Christmas Tree of hats, gloves, mittens, and scarves;
- Our annual Missions Christmas Tree of children's hats, gloves, scarves, and mittens saw 66 items for distribution to The Samaritan House, Our Daily Bread Soup Kitchen, and Elida Elementary School;

#### **Missions**

- During the week of July 11, St. Paul's provided substantial human and financial resources to a Harrison St., Lima residential refurbishment project as coordinated by Restoration Temple, S. Scott St., Lima. **Jamie Wyant and Tim Piper,** along with many of the same community volunteers who assisted the past several years at the UMCH Worthington summer project, were co-organizers and site directors for a very ambitious project that included three new sections of roof, two new porch roofs, a new porch deck, new rain gutters and down spouts, paint and landscape work. This project was featured August 13 in *The Lima News*, **Jamie Wyant** being an interviewee;
- To replenish our District's Flood Bucket inventory, **Jamie Wyant, Maedene Holmes, and Pastor Ruth** developed and coordinated St. Paul's donations for five flood buckets with spare inventory items for delivery to the District office by **Pastor Ruth** in August;
- St. Paul's donated close to \$250 to the annual *Brad Joseph Memorial Golf Outing* in July. Larry & Shirley Moser, Gene Craft, and Don Chaffins formed the St. Paul's foursome. Dan Best, Tim Piper, and Norm Grigsby assisted with tournament-day administrative duties. Brad's Uncle John Fleming addressed our congregation on June 5;
- **Jamie Wyant and Tim Piper** led a 12-person St. Paul's contingency to a three-day "summer mission project" in September to the U.M.C.-Conference Camp Wesley near Bellefontaine. St. Paul's was the primary force in making substantial repairs to an administration building followed-up with an **Art Holman** paint job;
- Mission Sunday, Sept. 25 involved **Marty's** annual Committee report; **Pastor Ruth's** sermon 'Hope for All People'; a Meals 'til Monday presentation by **Slone Whetstone**; the St. Paul's summer Harrison St./ramps/Camp Wesley projects summarized and presented by **Tim Piper**; and the ReFocus Initiatives presented by **Pastor Ruth**;
- We now have a Missions Committee bulletin board hanging in the education wing hallway outside the Pastor's office;
- Easter offering of \$706 was divided between the District's Miracle Offering and Lima-based ACTS 434 mission; Christmas offering of \$1,585.04 divided between the proposed Elida Community Center and the Allentown-Elida-Gomer Ministerial Association;
- 2011 Coins for Communion: Hope Visitation Center, \$89.26; Heartbeat of Lima, \$49.08; Our Daily Bread Soup Kitchen, \$59.77; 5 Loaves Food Pantry, \$77.96; United Methodist Children's Home, \$107.63; Relay for Life, \$99.70; Brad Joseph Memorial, \$139.38; Meals 'til Monday, \$51.31; The Samaritan House, \$54.75; Family Promise, \$34.81; Lima Rescue Mission, \$77.84; The Salvation Army, \$55.85;
- Conference 'Special' Sundays: One Great Hour of Sharing, \$156.00; World Communion Sunday, \$88.00; U.M. Student Sunday, \$87.00; Human Relations Day, \$73.00; Peace with Justice Day, \$36.00; Native American Awareness, \$40.00;



Buttery Corn Bread			
Ingredier	nts	Instructions by Jean May	
2/3 cup	Butter or margarine, softened	Preheat oven to 400 degrees	
1 cup	Sugar	In a mixing bowl, cream butter and sugar. Combine the eggs and milk.	
3	Eggs	Combine flour, cornmeal, baking powder and salt.





## **Living Our Faith**

#### **Practicing Lent**

Lent is a season of the church year when we think about the things that Jesus did while he lived on the earth and what it means to be God's followers. For some people, Lent is also a time to pay attention to ways they can share with others, focus on prayer, and look at ways they can show self-control. These are called the disciplines practices ofLent. Sometimes those words can have negative

associations—for example, disciple is something you when receive you something wrong. But did you ever think about how the word discipline is like the word disciple? As with anything we want to do well, practice is important. We practice sports, music, games, homework - all sorts of things!
