



Thank you for your attendance and participation in the five Sundays of Stewardship October 27 – November 24. Thanks for the fine luncheon sponsored by the Nurture Committee on Consecration Sunday. Pastor Paul focused on the 'Five Pillars of Methodism' including 'Extravagant Generosity': Fruitful congregations thrive because of extraordinary sharing, willing sacrifice, and joyous giving out of love for God and neighbor.

The Finance Committee finalized its expense budget for 2014 during its December 9 meeting. It will be presented to the Administrative Council on January 13, 2014, for review, approval, and implementation. Medical insurance, pension, Social Security/Medicare, and payroll increases created \$11,000 more in anticipated expenses for 2014 compared with 2013. To date, estimated giving is down a bit 2014 v. 2013 following a tally of pledge cards presented on Consecration Sunday. However, total 'estimated giving' is supplemented with various other forms of income. When factored in with our current surplus generated by early mortgage retirement, the Finance Committee will deliver a proposed budget in January which is very practicable, within our means, and meets our Mission and Vision Statements. A full report will appear in the February, 2014 newsletter.

Thank you for your overwhelming spirit of stewardship in the form of new Building Fund as nearly \$23,000 has been pledged to date. It is the Trustees' intent to use this fund for short-term, highly-visible improvements or repairs to our building and grounds. It will also serve as seed money for larger projects if need be or as emergency funding for remarkable unplanned expenses. More on this topic will be reported to the congregation on a quarterly basis.

And thank you for a very successful financial Year 2013! We again paid our District and Conference Apportionments 'in full' (\$19,129). We paid off our mortgage 17 months in advance. The Trustees enjoyed a very productive year in keeping up with repairs and improvements to our building and grounds (with a little assistance from the Village as consideration for the grant of a storm sewer easement across our north parking lot.) One result of this bounty is the addition of a budget line item in 2014 for Mission work – something we never had to date. God has showered our congregation with His blessings!



1/4 tsp.	Baking soda	non-stick cooking spray. Cool and enjoy your honey and locusts! Store leftovers in an airtight container.		




Country Egg Breakfast Casserole


Jesus' Baptism and Ours

Baptism is a sign of the relationship God initiates with us. We love because God first loves us. Water was used in Jesus' baptism, which we remember this year on January 12, and it is still used in baptism today. If you have been baptized, find out all you can about that day. Where were you baptized? When did it happen? Who was there, and what happened? Write down what you learned. Now read the story of Jesus' baptism in **Matthew 3:13-17** and compare your stories. What was similar? What was different? The main thing that all baptisms share is the water and the word of God: you are my beloved child. You can learn more about water and baptism through the following activities.
