

Dear Friends,

I opened up my Bible today to Matthew and my eyes fell upon verses out of the Sermon on the Mount: "You are salt of the earth; but if salt has lost its taste, how can its saltiness be restored? It is no longer good for anything, but is thrown out and trampled under foot. You are the light of the world. A city built on a hill cannot be hid. No one after lighting a lamp puts it under the bushel basket, but on the lamp stand, and it gives light to all in the house. In the same way, let your light shine before others, so that they may see your good works and give glory to your Father in heaven."

We will venture to amusement parks, zoos, monuments, and museums. As we go, in our everyday lives, we can let Christ's light shine forth, and we can offer encouragement, a friendly smile, sincere warmth, and even an invitation to join us in church at our source of the light that shines from us.

Have a safe and light giving summer, salted with the love and grace of Christ.






#### PASTORS SCHEDULE FOR JUNE:

#### **EDITOR'S 'Oops'**

In the May, 2011 edition of St. Paul's Epistle, a piece of the 'St. Paul's Missions Activities' article read: ".....anyone call 9-1-1?" with reference to the St. Paul's handicap ramp builders digging out a portion of front lawn during their construction work in Lima on April 9, 2011. This statement should have read: "....anyone call 8-1-1?" April was National Safe Digging Month. Anyone digging or pounding the earth in the installation of a mailbox, landscape/trees, basketball backboard pole, graduation party tent stakes, or backyard deck supports, to name a few, must dial 8-1-1 to register their excavation activity. The call is free, easy, and it's the law. Jeff Reiff, Marty White, and Susan Nartker work for utility companies in our area (Dominion East Ohio, Buckeye Pipe Line Co., L.P., and AEP, respectively). A call to 8-1-1 alerts all underground utility operators of pending excavation work and enables utility personnel to mark the approximate location of their facilities so that no damages occur during any disturbance of the earth over or near the utility. Lima has had its share of excavation accidents over the years (remember the explosion that destroyed the Tuttle Construction Company's office building near L.C.C. High School a few years ago?) One call to 8-1-1 before digging can keep everyone safe and financially sound! And now you know.....!

#### **RECENT ReFOCUS TEAM EVENTS**

Following the St. Paul's ReFocus Team's formal presentation to the congregation prior to the Sunday, April 10, 2011, service, the Team has met every Tuesday evening in order to prepare and finalize a Mission Plan for St. Paul's as determined by the participants of the three ReFocus Summit meetings January-March, 2011. Plans were also made for the Team's Leadership Retreat on May 14, 2011; however, springtime activities seem to have dominated many people's schedules and the Retreat was postponed to a date and time when a majority of Administrative Council members and other interested participants can engage in Leadership discussions and Mission Plan issues.

Mission Plan to guide Α our congregation's future ministry work is in final draft form. View it on-line at www.elidastpaulschurch.org The timeline for implementation of St. Paul's mission plan as finalized during the re-scheduled Leadership meeting is:

- A special charge conference will be convened by June 30, 2011;
- July-August, 2011 Administrative Council implementation of new Ministry Structure model;
- September 30, 2011 The people of St. Paul's move forward with a new focus and vision for ministry throughout the Elida community.

Just as the re-furbished fellowship hall or new roof or choir cantatas represented exciting times for our congregation over the years, so, too, is this ReFocus effort and the ensuing new Plan for implementation Mission of focused ministry efforts in and around Elida. We believe you will find mission and worship St. Paul's at an exciting endeavor as we face the challenges and opportunities which await us in the days and months ahead.




## The Holy Trinity God is wonderful and hard to describe



## **Living Our Faith**



#### Door of Fear/ Door of Adventure

My grandparents had a third floor in their spacious house. A door with a stairway led up to heaven knows what! As small children, my brother and I would sneak up to that door, dare each other to open it, slowly peer to the top of the stairs, and then run like the wind for Grandmother's lap in the kitchen.

In John 20:19 we read that the doors of the house where the disciples had met were locked for fear when Jesus came and stood among them and said, "Peace be with you."

One of the fundamental lessons of faith is that we need not fear. Jesus comes among us and grants us peace. We are not alone; the Holy Spirit is with us. The doors that are in front of us don't have to be locked for fear. They have been consecrated, in a way. Christ has turned them into portals to spiritual adventure. We may have a hard time believing that in a way that affects our behavior. We, like the disciples, need not only to be empowered with the Spirit of God, but shooed out of the house to get going on our way!

In the moment that Christ comes to the disciples and says, "Peace be with you," their defenses breached, their guard was let down, and they knew it would be okay. In the same way, with the Holy Spirit given to us by the risen Christ, our doors of fear can be transformed into portals to spiritual adventure. A future we could not have imagined can emerge before us. We are not alone; the Holy Spirit is with us.
