
Dear Friends. June, 2010

I have heard from some of the folks on the ReFocus Team that many of you still don't know what ReFocus is, and how it involves you. Following is a "Cliff Notes" version of an explanation of ReFocus, and where we are in the process. I will be giving you regular updates and will offer some more cliff notes in the coming months.

WHAT IS REFOCUS?

Over the past two years, you have been hearing me talk about something called "ReFocus" in the newsletter, in sermons, and in conversations and meetings. ReFocus is a process that prepares leaders in the church, beginning with the pastor, then with the rest of the congregation, to claim God's vision for their lives by focusing the leader on four core commitments:

Personal growth through God's Word. Spiritual power through intercessory prayer. Integrity through accountable relationship. Strategic mission through God's unique call.




PHASE I In the first

In the first phase of ReFocus, we are seeking to address God's mission call to leaders in the church. The first year of the process concentrated on me as your pastoral leader, and began to offer the Focused Living Retreats to you, the congregation, as a means for you to understand yourselves as leaders in God's mission to our community. St. Paul called this the "priesthood of all believers." ReFocus is NOT just for the pastor and Administrative Council. It is for every one who is a Christian and wants to see Christ's church thrive and grow. The Focused Living Retreats were offered several times last fall, and eleven people attended all together where they answered for themselves the questions:

Where have I been? Where am I now? What is God calling me to become?

In those retreats the persons present discovered their personal Biblical purpose, which is their personal mission statement; thought about and claimed their personal values, both positive and negative, out of which they live day to day; and wrote a personal vision statement. All of these documents together make up the individual personal calling statement, which is a best understanding to date of what the individual believes God is calling him or her to do to fulfill God's call on their life. By understanding what God's calling on your individual life is, together, we can begin to understand God's call to us as a congregation, as our calls are put together and we shape our missional ministries for the future.

For it is God who said, "Let light shine out of darkness," who has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ.

May the "light that shines out of darkness" bless you with grace and peace.

The theme for the June 7 -10, 2010 Annual Conference session is *Love in Action: Building Bridges Out of Poverty*. Ministry with the poor is one of the four missional foci affirmed by the 2008 General Conference. As we gather at Lakeside, we will be celebrating the multiple ways the congregations of the West Ohio Conference are engaged in ministry with those living in poverty. In a variety of teaching sessions we will learn how we can help sisters and brothers build bridges out of poverty.

In keeping with our theme, we will once again receive a **Love First Miracle Offering** at the 2010 Annual Conference Session for people who are poor. I invite each of our nearly 1,200 congregations to begin preparing, even now, to participate in this miraculous expression of our love in action. The needs are overwhelming, but God's grace is sufficient. Our state's economy continues to languish, but God's economy overflows with abundant life. Alone our impact is minimal, but **together we can** be used by God to accomplish a miracle.

Our **Love First Miracle Offering** goal is \$350,000 and 10,000 pounds of potatoes. The cash offering will be used to support impoverished children being treated at Grace Children's Hospital in Haiti and at our own United Methodist Children's Home in Worthington. Seventy per cent (70%) of the cash offering will support Grace Children's Hospital; the other thirty percent (30%) will go to the United Methodist Children's Home. Designated gifts will be honored. The potatoes will be distributed through the Society of St. Andrew to feed hungry people in the West Ohio Conference.



FINAL PREPARATIONS FOR JUNE 11-12, 2010 RELAY FOR LIFE EVENT BY ST. PAUL'S TEAM

The St. Paul's Allen County Cancer Society Relay for Life Team is concluding preparations for the June 11-12, 2010 event. To date, the Team has raised \$1,270 toward its goal of \$2,000. Moons and Stars can still be purchased for \$1 each; luminaries are available for \$10 each – see Team Captain Linda Holman for details.

On Friday, June 11, 2010, at the Allen County Airport on Hanthorn Rd., Perry Township, a survivors' reception kicks off the weekend's events at 4:30 p.m. At 6:00 p.m., a survivors' lap of the relay track begins the formal walk/run event through 3:00 p.m. Saturday, June 12, 2010. At dusk on Friday, Pastor Doug Adams will lead a luminary lighting ceremony (the luminaries form the outline of the relay track). Throughout the night, activities such as a cake auction, bingo, a scavenger hunt, sock hop, and donated items auction help keep attendees awake and occupied until sun-up Saturday.

Walkers are still needed for the St. Paul's team as well as persons to sell pop, water, and chips at our track-side tent. Contact Linda to donate your time to the Team. We all know of persons afflicted by cancer who are alive today to tell their amazing recovery stories. These stories are made possible only through research and education – and such research and education are made possible, in part, through fund raising efforts such as this June 11-12 relay event. 



ReFocus: continued from page I

PHASE II

For the last eight months, I, your pastor, have been involved in Phase II of the ReFocus Process to learn the skills and techniques to lead the congregation through a process of discovering God's missional call on us as a community of faith. As I reported in an earlier newsletter, a team has selected to help lead this process, and training for that team will be on June 26.

In the fall, we will start offering three separate days for what is called "Summits," which will be open to everyone in the congregation to attend. There will be a sign up in September for the first one. At Summit #1, we will answer the question, "Where have we been?" and we will develop a "journey wall" where we will remember where we have been, the good and the bad. We will also look at what the values we hold collectively as a congregation. Summit #2 will be held about 6-8 weeks after Summit #1, and we will answer the question, "Where are we now?" and hear a report of the community survey that has been going on for the last 2 years. Out of what we learn about ourselves in Summit #1 and the community report, we will have a realistic understanding of where we are now, our "current reality." In Summit #3, which will likely take place after the first of next year, we will answer the question, "How will we get there?" The work we accomplish at the final summit will inform the ReFocus Team and the Administrative Council in their work at a Leadership Retreat as they develop a Strategic Plan for Missional Ministry in our community, where we will concentrate our ministry and mission resources and energy for the next three to five years.

WHY REFOCUS?

The urgency of ReFocus for the congregation is clear: If St. Paul's continues in the current mode of operations, and we continue to decline, in 20 years, there will either be no St. Paul's UMC, or we will be yoked in a multiple point charge. In either case, St. Paul's will no longer be a witness for Christ in our community. The old adage is true: "If we always do what we've always done, we'll always be what we've always been." But, in our current day and age, what we've always been is just not enough, especially when we consider that statistics are showing that only about 4% of the millennial generation (those born in 1988 and after) will profess Jesus Christ as Lord, which we do in our vows of membership. God is calling the people of St. Paul's to faithfulness in finding our role in God's kingdom plan, to seek those who are lost, and to create opportunities for everyone to enter into God's presence.

What ReFocus Involves

ReFocus will involve offering the Focused Living Retreats several more times so that you may have an opportunity to participate and learn your personal calling from God. It will also involve your participation in the Summits and in some Pulse groups between each Summit, which can be done in our existing groups in the church.

What Will the Results of ReFocus be?

The results of ReFocus, through the work of the Summits, the ReFocus Team, and the Administrative Council, will be a Strategic Plan which will likely involve a restructuring of our Administrative Council for mission; some major decisions about our current mission focuses; the development of more intentional purpose in our outreach to seek new members and welcome visitors; development of small group ministries for making disciples; some changes in worship so that people feel they have encountered God when they leave; and increased emphasis on generous giving. In all of this, the greatest result will be an infusion of the Holy Spirit which will energize, excite, and empower the entire congregation. These are the marks, according to The United Methodist Church and the West Ohio Conference of "a healthy, growing, spiritually vital, risk-taking center for making and equipping disciples of Jesus Christ for the purpose of transforming the world."

I invite you to enter into the ReFocus process as we seek to discover where God is leading St. Paul's UMC to enlarge God's kingdom (God's presence) in our community and in the world.

Missions

MISSIONS COMMITTEE UPDATE

April and May 'Coins for Communion' to benefit the United Methodist Children's Home totaled \$140.84 (April) and \$69.34 (May).

Linda Craft and her St. Paul's Women's Book Club lead a church wide effort to prepare, collect, and deliver **health kits to benefit the U.M.C.O.R. disaster relief effort in Haiti** following the devastating earthquake. The women collected 14 health kits during March, 2010, and Linda delivered them to Dr. Eddy Bruno, Lima. Dr. Bruno was part of a group traveling to Haiti for Mission work and he delivered them along with other supplies as part of a community wide Haiti support effort. Linda also reported that the Women's Book Club has contributed \$445 to the **Volunteers in Mission** project associated with this summer's July-August mission work in Samara, Russia as part of the United Methodist Church's worldwide outreach.

On April 11, 2010, Lisa and Phil Wurster gave our congregation an update during the Sunday service sermon time on their **F.O.R.O.** (**Friends of Russian Orphans**) mission work. A freewill offering was taken and Treasurer Gene Craft sent a St. Paul's check to F.O.R.O. on May 5, 2010, in the amount of \$832.00.

On April 18, 2010, Jamie Wyant, Todd Hanes, and the St. Paul's Missions Committee held a kick-off rally for this summer's mission project at the **United Methodist Children's Home** in Worthington, OH. Jamie spoke during Sunday service announcement time, Todd presented a power-point seminar during a carry-in luncheon following the April 18 service, and \$231.00 was donated this date toward the St. Paul's \$2,000 pledge for this 2010 UMCH project. As of May 16, 2010, our congregation has enthusiastically supported St. Paul's commitment to mission with the UMCH as **we have exceeded our \$2,000 goal** that is part of a conference wide goal of \$26,000 for supplies and materials for the July UMCH Mission Week.

On April 30, 2010, Larry and Gloria Brunk; Becky Bean; Denny Grapner; and Bill McKinney donated their time at **Our Daily Bread Soup Kitchen** on Central Ave. in Lima during the Noontime meal. St. Paul's supports ODB every 5th Friday of the month.

St. Paul's supports the **medical clinic and pharmacy in Nuevo Progresso, Mexico**, a favorite mission site of the late Brad Joseph. Shara and Kim Bowsher also performed mission work here. Part of our 2009 Easter offering was dedicated to this Mexican clinic and pharmacy. On May 8, 2009, Treasurer Gene Craft sent a check to a Columbus-based liaison agency in the amount of \$375.50 on behalf of our congregation. We recently received a thank-you from the West OH Conference Chairman of the Partnership with the Oriental Conference, Mr. John Keeny, King Avenue U.M.C., Columbus, OH.

Thanks to all people of St. Paul's for your spirit of mission and contribution to our community and to our world!







Living Our Faith

Listening to the Silence

The reading for June 20 (1 Kings 19:1-15) tells the story of Elijah hearing God's voice in a "still, small voice" (KJV) or "the sound of sheer silence" (NRSV). What an amazing image!

A quick recap of the life of Elijah: he was feeling threatened, and fled for his life. As he found himself hungry he prayed for God to take him, but this did not happen. Finally, he hid in a cave. He did not stay there long – a voice called him outside.

A great wind came, and Elijah looked for God in the wind, but God was not there. This was followed by an earthquake, but

still Elijah could not find God. Last came a great fire – and again, no God.

Elijah paused – probably with a very puzzled look on his face – and listened. It was only then that he heard the "sound of sheer silence" and in that moment he heard the voice of God.

Macrina Wiederkehr in her book Seven Sacred Pauses says this about silence:

Silence is like a river of grace inviting us to leap unafraid into its beckoning depths. It is dark and mysterious in the waters of grace. Yet in the silent darkness we are given new eyes. In the heart of the divine we can see more clearly

who we are. We are renewed and cleansed in this river of silence. There are those among you who fear the Great Silence. It is a foreign land to you. Sometimes it is good to leap into the unknown. Practice leaping.

Can we do that? Can we pause long enough in our busy lives to leap into the great silence? Can we let the wind, earthquake, and fire of our busyness lapse away, that we might spend at least a few moments in the silent presence of God?
