

Well, I am going to declare March as the month Spring should arrive, but as I write this in February it remains only a hope. I want to talk to you this month about several things, first being the new system we are setting up for contacting you in case the church should

We will notify you as soon as possible that church will be canceled, but if there is a level 2 snow emergency we will be canceling services automatically. Where do you look for snow emergency levels? <u>www.allen-ema.com</u> is the official site for Allen County Ohio Emergency Management Agency where you can see what snow level we are currently under. This policy is still being discussed and I hope at the Ad Board in March to finalize the policy for the church.

March 2nd is Camp Sunday this year and we will have Heather Brake from Camp Wesley visiting to talk to us about camping opportunities for kids and adults in the West Ohio Conference. I invite you to show up in your camp gear and be ready to sing camp songs, remember your church camp experience and maybe even have a s'more treat. Heather will also be talking to us about mission events that will be happening at Camp Wesley and how we can make a child's experience at camp even better. My goal this year is to have at least 6 kids from St. Paul's going to church camp this year and with week long camps in the \$3-\$400 range we need to be ready to make some donations to cover half of kid's camp cost as we have in the past.

The beginning of Lent is Ash Wednesday on March 5th this year and we will be having a service at 7pm to begin the Lenten Season. I want to invite you all to this special service and to make a pledge this year to add something new to your life with Christ. I know many people give up something for Lent which is a good practice to remember Christ's sacrifice for you, but I would challenge each of you to add something for remembering Christ's sacrifice as well. Maybe that could include reading the Bible 10 minutes per day, or if you already do that praying 10 minutes per day for the needs of others or if you already do all those things? What else could you do for God for 10 minutes per day that you don't already do: listening to a friend, helping someone, watching for evidence of God's love in the world, singing hymns, whatever it is you decide to add, do it with the intention of learning more about your Creator. If you will join me in adding something for God I know you will be blessed this next 40 days of Lent.




EASY (Elida After School Youth) Program



The Great U-Turn



lived in I St. Louis for three vears while I was attending seminary. While I was there I noticed something radicallv different from the large metropolitan area where I had been raised. Precisely, it was the way in which the drivers in that citv made

U-turns at the most unpredictable moments and inopportune times. It didn't matter how crowded the streets were. It made no difference how many cars were coming toward the driver. That driver would carefully calculate his or her move and then make the U-turn, much to the astonishment and anger of the other drivers.

The word repent means "to change." Literally, it means to make a U-turn. What St. Louis drivers were determined to accomplish on busy streets is not done quite so easily by those who are called to change their ways. We are creatures of habit, and old habits die hard. Maybe that habit is a way we have of behaving when we are with our siblings. Perhaps it's the way we act around the people we love. Maybe we not only eat to live, but we live to eat, and we find ourselves paying dearly for our appetites.

When repentance is the topic, however, we are talking about more than just changing habits; we are describing a change in our lives. In repentance, we acknowledge and confess that deep within us is a desire to be like God. Repentance calls us to say to God and to one another that we have been guilty of the primal sin, of wanting to be our own God. In the end, repentance doesn't deal directly with outward appearances; repentance deals with inner matters of the heart.

Sometimes repentance can seem tied up in our fears. When we are afraid we sometimes make changes as a sign of appeasement. We change because if we don't, we fear we will be marked by evil, rather than with God's grace.

However, we live on this side of Calvary, and so we need not be slaves to fear. No matter what comes,


our risen Lord and Savior goes before us. Reinforced by the confidence of this promise, our faith empowers us to change, not because we have to or because we are afraid of the ultimate consequences of staying the same. Rather, we make our own personal U-turn with the help of God's Holy Spirit who moves us from fear to faith.

There truly are days in our lives that we dread: that trip to the dentist, tax day, the results of the MRI, the day the divorce decree is final, perhaps even the day that we die. We tend to view those days in terms of judgment, thinking about all the things we could or should have done differently. Those days sometimes leave us with guilt and remorse about what we have left incomplete, or relationships that remain broken, or our own inability to turn things around financially or emotionally.

During those days it is tempting for us to try to strike a deal with God. Those are the days when we say to God, "God, if we receive a favorable result, we promise that we will change our ways, our attitudes, or our lifestyles." And even when the news is good, our deal is short-lived and we soon return to the patterns we knew before.

How different it is with our journey of faith. The crucified and risen Christ journeys with us, calls us to change - to repent - and to follow him. With the power of the Holy Spirit, Jesus, the Christ, gives us the strength to complete that U-turn. And as we do, Jesus will be with us every minute and each mile of the way.



Cinnabon-Like Cinnamon Rolls

Ingredients		Instructions
1 pkg.	Active dry yeast (1/4 oz. size)	Dissolve yeast in warm milk in large bowl.
1 cup	Warm milk (105-110 degrees F; microwave milk 45-60 seconds)	Mix together sugar, margarine, salt and eggs. Add flour and yeast and mix well.
1/2 cup	Granulated sugar	Knead dough into large ball, using your hands dusted lightly with flour. Put in bowl, cover tightly with plastic wrap so it doesn't
1/3 cup	Margarine, melted	form a crust, and let rise in warm place 1 hour, or until the dough
1 tsp.	Salt	has doubled in size. (Can turn oven on warm, then turn off and use as a warm place.)
2	Eggs	Roll dough out on lightly floured surface. Roll the dough flat
4 cups	flour	until it is approx. 21 inches long and 16 inches wide. It should be about 1/4 in. thick. Some recipes suggest spreading the dough
		with 1/4 cup margarine before adding the filling.
Filling:		Preheat oven to 400 degrees.
1 cup	Packed brown sugar	Filling:
2 1/2 Tbl.	Cinnamon	Combine brown sugar and cinnamon in a bowl. Spread the softened margarine evenly over the surface of the dough, then
1/3 cup	Margarine, softened	sprinkle evenly with cinnamon and sugar.
		Working carefully from the top (21-inch side), roll the dough
Icing:		down to the bottom edge. Cut the rolled dough into 1 3/4-inch slices and place 6 at a time, evenly spaced, in a lightly greased
8 Tbs. (1 stick)	Margarine, softened	baking pan. Let the rolls rise again until double in size (about 30
1 1/2 cups	Powdered sugar	min.) Bake for 10 min., or until light brown on top. Coat roll generously with icing.
1/4 cup (2 oz.)	Cream Cheese	Hints:
1/2 tsp.	Vanilla extract	These rolls can be frozen after baking. Just put in microwave for 20-30 seconds to reheat.
1/8 tsp.	Salt	You can line the pan with foil, then lightly butter or spray the foil to make it easier to lift rolls out of pan onto a serving plate.

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

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# **Living Our Faith**

#### Welcome to Lent!

The season of Lent lasts for 40 days. This year, it begins Wednesday, March 5, on a day we call Ash Wednesday. During the six weeks of Lent we remember things that Jesus said and did and we think about what we are doing to follow in his way. It can be a good time to focus on prayer and on giving to others. Try some of these activities to learn more about prayer with your friends or family.

#### **Prayer Cross**

Lent is a good time to think about prayer and to practice praying regularly. You can use prayers that are already written, like the Lord's Prayer or you can write or say prayers of your own. Making a prayer cross is something you can do with your family to practice prayer each day.

Make a cross out of thick branches or recycled cardboard tubes. Hold the pieces in position and wrap string or twine around the intersection of the two cross pieces until they are secure. Hang it on the wall or stand it up with a base of rocks. Whenever you have a worry or a struggle, write it on a piece of paper and tape it to the cross. You can also write down joys and thanksgivings. All of these are prayers. Gather with your family around the cross as often as you can. Share the things you are praying. We don't know how or when our prayers will be answered, but we can remember that God loves us and is with us through everything.
