

Dear Friends,

Alleluia! Christ is risen! What a joyful season we are now in as we begin to live into what it means to be resurrected people. We got

there this year by taking an intense look at the last 24 hours of Jesus' life. There were many people involved in making the Lenten worship experiences meaningful to everyone. Let me take this opportunity to thank those who were involved behind the scenes:

<u>First Sunday in Lent</u>: The Worship Team put together a triclinium, a table that looked like the one that was used in the days of Jesus, and was likely like the one used for the Last Supper. Thank you to the worship team for your creativity, time, and efforts throughout the season.

Second Sunday in Lent: Rich Solo created 'rocks' so that we could get a sense of where Jesus prayed that night. Kathy White set up the greenery used so that we could feel like we were in the garden as we heard about Jesus' journey to Gethsemane.

<u>Third Sunday in Lent</u>: Rich once again used his artistic ability to create a fire so that we could feel like we were in the courtyard with Peter during Jesus' trial.

Fourth Sunday in Lent: While communion is central for first Sundays, Rich created a scene that gave the impression of Pilate's seat of judgment by using one of the chairs from the chancel, an old table top, and a carpet runner.

Fifth Sunday in Lent: Rich Solo, Larry Moser, and Jamie Wyant brought a large log into the chancel and created a whipping post to represent the place where Jesus was beaten. A flagellum was made with leather strips to demonstrate the horror of that moment in Jesus' life. Kathy White and Myrna Metzger gave us a sense of the royalty with the long purple cloth to represent the robe put on Jesus during the mocking, and a wreath made of thorns gave us a sense of the crown put on Jesus.

<u>Palm/Passion Sunday</u>: Jamie Wyant crafted an authentic cross from barn wood, and Rich Solo, Larry Moser, Scott Fessler, Marty White, and Tony Shoup brought it in during the choir's anthem and assembled it for us. Myrna fashioned a crown of thorns for us to experience the crucifixion first hand.

The visual settings for worship this Lenten season allowed us to journey to the cross and understand all that God did for us in Jesus to atone for our human condition and bring us back into a joyful relationship with the God who loves each one of us.

This season ended as we celebrated a Seder meal on Maundy Thursday that included the institution of the Lord's Supper in the Fellowship Hall. Thank you to the Nurture Committee for your work to make it a special evening.

Finally, I want to thank our fairly new technical team, who prepared the visuals each week, including power points and film clips to help us put the story in context.

All of this prepared us to truly celebrate the Alleluias of Easter. I pray that each of you will continue to find life, joy, and grace throughout this joyful season.



ST. PAUL'S MISSIONS ACTIVITIES

On Saturday, April 9, 2011, St. Paul's completed another Ramps 'n Roofs mission project. An approximate 60' long handicap ramp constructed at a residence on S. Scott St. in Lima included three transition decks and three sections of boardwalk. It serves two wheelchair bound children living at this residence.

Jamie Wyant assembled the three decks and three boardwalk frames prior to April 9, then loaded them onto a trailer the morning of April 9 for transport to the job site. Marty White, Rich Solo, and Larry Moser assisted Jamie in assembling all the pre-constructed pieces on-site in addition to finishing the boardwalks and installing wooden railings the entire length of the ramp. The transition area from driveway to ramp required hand excavation of a portion of front yard (anyone call 8-1-1?). What an impressive sight: four people, four shovels – all in motion: no State workers here! Although the sledge hammer never came out, there were a few spur-of-the-moment modifications to plan when connecting the top deck to the front porch or attaching legs to the remaining deck pieces. Attaining proper slope of the ramps is always a challenge. The rain held off and our missioners completed this task all in a day's work, 8 a.m. – 5 p.m.! On Monday, April 11, 2011, St. Paul's congregation was recognized as an outstanding volunteer church during the annual meeting and appreciation dinner of Our Daily Bread Soup Kitchen, S. Central St., Lima. Our Daily Bread Board Member and Nurture Committee Chairperson Martha Vasquez and Missions Committee Co-Chairperson Marty White attended on behalf of St. Paul's. Our congregation serves this soup kitchen every fifth Friday of the month or about 4-5 times throughout the year. 

SUMMARY OF ReFOCUS SUMMIT #3: 'HOW WILL WE GET THERE?'

On March 26, 2011, the ReFocus Team held their last of three ministry summits collectively designed to formulate ideas and methods for our congregation to implement in making disciples of Christ throughout our community. The intent is to develop a ministry structure and people flow process that creates progress out of programs, accomplishment rather than mere activity. Programs and practices that are no longer effective are to be discontinued.

We started the day with an introduction to a 'People Flow Diagram'. This process outlines how our congregation and its leaders should engage visitors to our church including several stages such as 'Welcome hospitality', follow-up, group involvement, meeting with our Pastor, all leading up to membership at St. Paul's. Each step of this process will have a church worker assigned to it. We next addressed changes to our church's administrative processes or methods of ministry implementation. Going forward, we intend to approach the administration of our ministries as such:

STRATEGIC MINISTRY
Run by
MINISTRY TEAMS
Supported by
ADMINISTRATIVE TEAMS
Held accountable to ministry by
ADMINISTRATIVE COUNCIL.

Instead of the Administrative Council driving the train and blowing the whistle, control in carrying out our congregation's mission work will lie with specific Ministry Teams. The Administrative Council will lend support and direction but will not offer 'how to' complete any given task, or need to give permission for tasks of ministries to be accomplished.

Next: Strategic initiatives – these are big lever items which produce change and generate momentum. They require the attention of the *entire* congregation. Strategic initiatives define our congregation and represent our values, our mission and vision statements, and our Biblical purpose statement. They describe who we are and what we are about. When someone asks why you belong to St. Paul's U.M.C., or why should they join our church, our work throughout the community as qualified by our strategic initiatives is our answer. It's how we impact our community and how we live out our vision statement.

We then moved into break-out sessions to select and develop said strategic initiatives. By the end of this Summit, participants generated five strategic initiatives:

- 1. Help establish a community center with emphasis on youth & elderly;
- 2. Caring for elderly monthly/quarterly Sr. day out with associated activities and transportation as required;
- 3. Encouraging parents;
- 4. Provide community improvements;
- 5. Outdoor activities.

These five initiatives represent the focus and priorities of ministry at St. Paul's U.M.C. during the next 3-5 years. Each group associated with each particular initiative derived a preliminary set of goals and action steps. Since this Summit 3 session, the ReFocus Team has assigned a Team leader to each initiative with the exception of Initiatives 4 & 5. The thought here is to move these initiatives under the heading of the current Missions Committee.

On Sunday, April 10, 2011, the ReFocus Team made a formal presentation to the congregation which described the Team's work to date culminating with said strategic initiatives. In essence, the Team took a 'pulse check' of the congregation relative to its work and associated results. Consequently, the Team welcomes any questions, comments, or suggestions regarding any aspect of this ReFocus process and the recommendations that will be made to Administrative Council in the near future.

Presently, the ReFocus Team is finalizing its Mission Plan for St. Paul's. This plan summarizes and outlines all results generated during the three Summit sessions culminating with the strategic initiatives.

On Saturday, May 14, 2011, from 9:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. in the church's Fellowship Hall, a Leadership Retreat will be held. The purpose of this retreat is to transfer ownership of the Mission Plan and its execution from the Team to the Administrative Council. This plan will generate an awareness and set priorities for how St. Paul's will impact the community in alignment with the will of God as a result of this ReFocus process.

If you are a church leader, please plan to attend this Retreat on May 14 as we seek your participation during this final phase of the ReFocus process. For the remainder of the congregation, please join one of the newly-formed Ministry Teams that will live out St. Paul's vision for mission work as Christ's disciples throughout our community.




Welcoming Jesus
