# **Church History**

St. Paul received a "One Hundred Percent Achiever Church" certificate for paying in full our apportionments, which support United Methodism's Ministries Across the West Ohio Conference and throughout the World. It was signed by Bishop Bruce R. Ough and District Superintendent Philip Brooks. Our members should be proud of accomplishing this.

Rev. James Kuhn was our interim minister for the month of January, 2002. Rev. Larry Snyder, along with his wife, Beth, moved into the parsonage and he became St. Paul's minister in February, 2002.

In June, 2002, the American Cancer Society held its Relay for Life walk at the Elida Middle School. For the first time Elida St. Paul co-sponsored a team with the Regional Transit Authority (RTA). Money raised is used for cancer research. Carole Grapner and Linda Holman were the team captains. The St. Paul/RTA team raised \$1,300.

On August 17, more than 30 volunteers from St. Paul UMC set up the chairs for the grandstand concert at the Allen Co. Fair and took them down after the concert. This is a great money maker for our church.

On September 8, a September 11 Memorial Service was held at Immanuel United Methodist Church in the evening. Pastors Gary Rode and Larry Snyder conducted the worship service.

By December 31, 2002, St. Paul once again received a certificate signed by Bishop Bruce Ough for being a One Hundred Percent Achiever Church. Paying our apportionments in full supports United Methodism's Ministries across the West Ohio Conference and throughout the world. You should be proud!

On April 20, 2003, Rev. Snyder confirmed 5 youth from our church: Megan Bible, Lindsey Reiff, Kayla Stewart, Jenni Theodore, and Kelly Warris.

In June, 2003, St. Paul and RTA again co-sponsored a team for the American Cancer Society's Relay for Life walk. This time it was held at the Allen County Fairgrounds. With wonderful support from the people of St. Paul's Church, the team surpassed their goal of \$1,500 by raising \$2,058!

A group of volunteers from St. Paul's build ramps at homes for handicapped persons. In recognition of this, the Allen County Board of MRDD presented St. Paul United Methodist with the Good Neighbor Award plaque, which hangs in the front entrance to the sanctuary, across from the Bride's Room. Thank you to all the people to do this worthwhile project. St. Paul volunteers worked on a house for Habitat for Humanity in the summer.





# POP-UP CARD

Share the good news of Jesus' birth with this creative Christmas card.


#### What you need:

- Construction paper (two pieces, including one white)
- Pencil
- Scissors
- Pens
- Glue stick



#### What you do:

- 1. Neatly fold the white paper in half, short side to short side.
- 2. Draw two parallel lines (at least 2 inches apart) from the fold to about halfway to the edge. Cut along the lines.
- 3. Fold the cut section back and forth so it pops up.
- 4. Push the section up so it pops up inside the folded paper. Draw a nativity scene on the pop-up box.
- 5. Fold the colored paper in half, short side to short side. Place the white paper inside it and glue the white paper down, being careful not to glue the pop-up box.
- 6. Write a Christmas message and give or send the card to someone.
