

Preparation for the coming of the King is the reason we celebrate the Advent Season, but we are going to look at things a little differently this year. As we prepare for the birth of our Savior, I want to look at some of the events that followed His birth and "Find Christ in Christmas". We will be looking at 4 events in the life of the young Messiah and

how we find Christ in Christmas through each encounter. I want to share with you the story of a man so jealous and afraid for his kingdom that he searched through out his kingdom for young Jesus to murder him. Not finding him, he was infuriated to the point of genocide of a generation of young boys to protect his reign.

We will look at the men who watched the stars in the sky and knew that the world was changing. I will wonder with you what drove men to seek the King in the west, and how that same search for knowledge and truth drives us to seek Christ today. We seek knowing that whatever gift we bring will never be enough, but assured that just a glimpse at Jesus' greatness will cause us to fall on our knees to worship Him.

Next, the wisdom of the age will bring us to a deeper understanding of how Jesus frees us to explore new areas of our life. How 2 people of great faith give us the courage to never give up on God, who will appear to us if we are only faithful. Simeon and Anna prayed to see the Savior before their end and how their bold faith led them to see the infant King in the temple just 8 days after His birth.

Finally, we will wrap up the advent journey with the most common people of all, but also the most important people who God chose first to declare that the Messiah was born in Bethlehem. People like you and I, hard at work, living their everyday life. Who, when they heard the news, had to go see for themselves what the angels had declared to them in the fields as they watched their flocks. Be amazed at what they heard and who they saw that night and know God's love will always be made known to us, the ordinary people of the world.

Join me, won't you? Experience Advent with new eyes and an open heart. Also, come out on Christmas Eve to either the 6 or 10 pm candlelight services to celebrate Jesus' birth. Be on the look out for the Cookie Walk, the Christmas Home Walk, Dish it Out Café and as always, I'll see you in the mission field.

Holly was first used by pagans to decorate for the festival of Saturnalia. When Christians began celebrating Christmas in

honor of Christ, they adapted that decorating practice to reflect Jesus' life and death. Holly's pointed leaves symbolize the crown of thorns and its red berries symbolize Christ's blood shed on the cross. Because holly thrives and its berries retain their brilliance even in harsh winter conditions, non-Christians saw it as a symbol of eternity — which is fitting for Christians as well.

Grandma's Apron

A little history about grandma and her apron

The principle use of grandma's apron was to protect the dress underneath, but along with that, it served as a holder for removing hot pans from the oven; it was wonderful for drying children's tears.

From the chicken-coop the apron was used for carrying eggs, fussy chicks, and sometimes half-hatched eggs to be finished in the warming oven.

When company came those aprons were ideal hiding places for shy kids; and when the weather was cold, grandma wrapped it around her arms.

Those big old aprons wiped many a perspiring brow, bent over the hot wood stove. Chips and kindling wood were brought into the kitchen in that apron.

From the garden, it carried all sorts of vegetables. After the peas had been shelled it carried out the hulls. In the fall the apron was used to bring in apples that had fallen from the trees.

When unexpected company drove up the road, it was surprising how much furniture that old apron could dust in a matter of seconds.

When dinner was ready, Grandma walked out onto the porch, waved her apron, and the men knew it was time to come in from the fields for dinner.

It will be a long time before someone invents something that will replace that old-time apron that served so many purposes.

Remember this!! Grandma used to set her hot baked apple pies on the windowsill to cool. Her granddaughters set theirs on the windowsill to thaw.



Scalloped Chicken (Turkey) Casserole

1 cup	Green onions, chopped
1 cup	Celery, chopped
1 small	Pepper, green or sweet red, chopped
1/2 cup	Carrots, shredded
2	Garlic cloves, minced
2 Tbl.	Vegetable oil
2 cups	Chicken, cooked, cubed
1 cup	Cheddar cheese, shredded
1 cup	Mozzarella cheese, part skim, shredded
1/2 cup	Mayonnaise
1 Tbl. or	Parsley, minced fresh or
1 tsp.	Dried parsley flakes
14 slices	Whole wheat bread,
	day old, cubed
4	Eggs, large
2 cups	Milk, whole
1 can	Cream of chicken soup,
10-3/4 oz.	condensed undiluted
1 Tbl.	Worcestershire sauce
Sprinkle	Paprika
over top	

Preheat oven to 350 degrees.

Instructions

In a skillet soute enions energy normals countries

In a skillet, saute onions, green peppers, carrots and garlic in oil until crisp-tender. Transfer to a large bowl.

Add chicken, cheeses, mayonnaise and parsley.

Place 1/2 of bread cubes in greased 13x9-in. baking dish. Top with chicken mixture and remaining bread.

In a bowl, beat eggs; add milk, soup and Worcestershire sauce, pour over casserole. Sprinkle with paprika.


Bake uncovered for 1 hour and 10 minutes or until a knife inserted comes out clean.

Make some Christmas candles to remember Jesus, the Light of the world.




What you need:
