



Missions Report

ST.PAUL'S MISSION ACTIVITIES YEAR-END REPORT

The St. Paul's Missions Committee holds as its Mission Statement:

'We are called to be of service to others in the name of Christ Jesus and, therefore, we shall offer our time, talent, and offerings as our commitment to mission at St. Paul's Church'

ST. PAUL'S CONGREGATION AND MISSIONS COMMITTEE EFFORTS DURING 2013:

- St. Paul's and three other UMC churches hosted quarterly meetings of the **Lima Area Methodist Men's group** (L.A.M.M.), to listen to presentations on local mission work. Over \$500 was donated by LAMM to mission projects, both local and in the Ohio Conference;
- Jesus said to "feed my sheep." Donations of food for the Allentown UMC **Five Loaves Food Pantry** continued to be strong in 2013 with St. Paul's individuals faithfully filling the food bins every month. Thank you to all who donate food to feed those families who are in need in our Elida community;
- St. Paul's has monetarily supported the **Meals 'til Monday** mission which provides weekend meals to children from various elementary schools in and around Allen County;
- St. Paul's continued to serve the needy at the Central Ave., Lima **Our Daily Bread Soup Kitchen** on every fifth Friday that occured during the year. Numerous individuals represented St. Paul's as volunteers at the soup kitchen during the four 2013 dates, serving 100 to 200 persons at each gathering;
- Maedene Holmes, and her band of workers assembled **school kits (74) and health kits (22)** donated by numerous members of our congregation as part of this annual November mission effort. Pastor Paul delivered the kits to the local collection point for the West Ohio Conference **Festival of Sharing**;
- The small group, **Crafty Creatures** continues to bless our congregation and our community with their work of **prayer shawls**, **blankets**, **and quilts**. They also made significant contributions to our annual Mission **Christmas Tree of hats**, **gloves**, **mittens**, **and scarves** which are donated to the Samaritan House, Our Daily Bread Soup Kitchen, and the Elida Elementary School;
- June 2nd was "Mission's Sunday" at St. Paul's. A PowerPoint presentation was given by the Mission's Committee and Pastor Paul's message was about our missions at St. Paul's. Jamie Wyant, Maedene Holmes, Dennis & Shara Bowsher, Norm Grigsby and Tim & Corinne Piper from the Mission's Committee helped with the service. After the service there was a meal to raise funds for the Camp Wesley summer mission project.
- St. Paul's donated \$100 to the annual **Brad Joseph Memorial Golf Outing** in July. Larry & Shirley Moser, Tim Theodore, and Margie Best formed the St. Paul's golf foursome with their golf fees going to the memorial fund. Dan Best, Tim Piper, Jamie Wyant, Sue Theodore and Norm Grigsby assisted with tournament-day administrative duties. The BJ Memorial Fund has given out scholarships for Medical Mission trips to Kenya, Dominican Republic, Haiti, Mexico & Uganda in the past five years;
- Check out our **Missions Committee bulletin board** located on the wall of the education wing hallway outside the Pastor's office on which are posted **'thank-you' letters and upcoming mission opportunities**; Jamie Wyant led a team from St. Paul's (and other local churches) on several weekends on a "summer mission project" to **the U.M.C. Camp Wesley** near Bellefontaine during June, July and August. Volunteers included Art Holman, Jamie Wyant, Dennis & Shara Bowsher, Larry and Shirley Mosier, Paul Scannell, Maedene Holmes, Norm Grigsby, and Tim & Corinne Piper. Volunteers completed work on all four porches; steps and railings on the dining hall and either replaced or repaired them. Boardwalks were built and a small bridge rebuilt on the path leading around the lake;
- October 31ST was **trick-or-treat night in Elida** and St. Paul's was ready to serve hot chocolate and coffee to parents and hand out pencils with our name and time of service. Except trick-or-treat was cancelled due to bad weather and rescheduled for Saturday, November 2. So on November 2 our intrepid missionaries showed up again and started handing out cups of hot drinks and special pencils with St. Paul's info. They kept handing them out until they ran out of hot chocolate. So, instead of shutting down, they went to Dollar General and

bought 8 boxes of chocolate mix and raided the Scannell's kitchen for all of their chocolate (and marsh-mallows). In the end, around 360 cups of drinks were shared, although a few were exchanged for hot dogs from Elida Immanuel UMC. Many thanks to those who shared in the work and the joy of this mission project: Vicki and Torie McAdams, Deb and Gary Hurd, Mary Williams, Cari Metzger, Shirley Shoup and Marla Scannell.

- **Jamie Wyant** went on a mission trip to **Haiti** at the end of October with **Living Hope Ministries** to help repair water wells. With 9.7 million people, Haiti has no centralized water system so thousands of wells supply clean, safe water to many people. Many wells fall in disrepair and need to be fixed. Jamie gave a presentation about his trip to Haiti on November 17th and gave insight as to the conditions in Haiti;
- The St. Paul's Book Club donated \$856.95 to missions designating it to be distributed evenly between the Lima Area Food Bank, The Samaritan House, Meals-til-Monday and Our Daily Bread soup kitchen. Thank you to the Book Club for their generous donation.
- Thank you to everyone who got online and voted for **Owen Weaver**, the handicapped young man from Bluffton, to help his family to try to win a Van with a wheel-chair lift. With your help, he garnered 18,710 votes and was a semi-finalist. He made it into the top 5% and was a finalist, however he did not win one of the two vans being awarded. Thank-you for all of you who took time to vote for Owen.

The people of St. Paul's United Methodist Church **donated over \$11,000** to special missions, coins-for-communion, United Methodist Special Sundays, special designated Sundays and other missions and ministries of our church. See "2013 ST. PAUL'S SPECIAL MISSIONS GIVING SUMMARY", found elsewhere in the newsletter. Thank you to all who donated to these missions.

Many thanks to the members of the Mission Committee for 2013: Jamie Wyant, Norm Grigby, Maedene Holmes, Dennis & Shara Bowsher, Tim Piper and Pastor Paul Scannell. Also, many thanks to members of our congregation who faithfully volunteered at Our Daily Bread soup kitchen; worked on quilts, hats & mittens; assembled health and school kits; worked or played golf at the Brad Joseph Memorial Golf Outing; helped with LAMM breakfasts; donated food faithfully to 5 Loaves Food Pantry; worked on ramps; volunteered at Camp Wesley church camp and donated to special missions, projects and funds. You are truly a blessing to the many people who have been served by the sweat and generous donations of our congregation at St. Paul's United Methodist Church.

Finance Report

The Finance Committee, also responsible for issues of Stewardship, met Sept.-Dec., 2013, to address general operating and building fund revenue and expense activities, estimate of giving protocols, and 2014 budget development. An Ad Hoc Committee for Mortgage Burning and Building Fund Perpetuation also met several times over the summer and early fall. Many thanks to Margie Best, Treasurer, and Carole Grapner, Financial Secretary, and Gene Craft, Treasury Consultant, for their diligence and dedication in administrating the financial records, accounts, and ledgers of St. Paul's. The sound financial health of St. Paul's is due, in part, to their commitment to fiscal responsibility.

For 2013, receipts exceeded expenses by \$19,021. Cost containment consistent with our expense budget, above-average winter 2012-2013 temperatures, and early retirement of our mortgage liability are main contributors to this surplus. It should also be noted that St. Paul's received a generous anonymous gift of \$10,000 in 2013. We paid our District and Conference apportionments in full (total \$19,129.) The Board of Trustees enjoyed a very productive year while keeping within their budget limits aided by the Aug.-Dec. building fund surplus. Program Ministries, church mission, and various outreach initiatives had the financial means for attaining their goals for 2013. In general, the entire congregation of St. Paul's should be commended for living our Mission and Vision Statements as indicated by our 2013 fiscal performance.

For 2014, our expense budget increased \$10,966 over 2013 or \$170,567 compared with \$159,601. This increase is due to medical insurance (+\$3,276); pension (+\$800); SS/Medicare (+\$248); church utilities and insurance (+\$1,936); and staff salaries (+\$4,652.) For 2014, the Choir Director's salary was reinstated at \$2,500 as part of the staff salary increases. Pastor Paul received a \$1,500 increase. Staff (5) in general received a 3% salary increase. Copies of the 2014 expense budget are available in the church office or by calling the office and requesting a copy by mail.

Estimates of Giving for 2014 totaled \$139,304 by 46 giving units compared to \$144,724 by 54 giving units in 2013. Theoretically in 2013 Estimated Giving funded 91% of our expense budget; for 2014, Estimated Giving provides for approximately 82% of our expense budget. Non-pledged giving and loose plate offerings significantly fill this funding gap. We don't spend all budgeted expense items, too. Consequently, we usually maintain an adequate working cash balance to sustain our committee work, program ministries, Mission and Vision Statements.

THANK YOU!

Pastor Paul discussed the Five Pillars of Methodism during Stewardship season October 27 – November 24, 2013. 'Stewardship Moments' included a presentation on St. Paul's finances and associated financial budget. Jamie Wyant presented his experiences and impressions of a recent Haiti mission trip. Pastor Paul discussed and gave examples of radical hospitality and worship. In re-energizing our St. Paul's Mission and Vision statements, this season brought to light God's expectation of us: 'What have you done with all I have given you?'

On Consecration Sunday, November 24, we committed a portion of our incomes for the work of His church as Estimate of Giving cards were collected and summarized. A total of \$139,304 has been pledged to sustain St. Paul's U.M.C. as an inviting community of Christ's disciples. This sum represents approximately 82% of the 2014 general operating budget. Well done!

Despite burning our mortgage in July, 2013, the Administrative Council asked you to perpetuate the Building Fund. The response was overwhelming: \$23,220 has been pledged for 2014 short-term/highly-visible capital improvements within our building and grounds. Look for periodic reports from the Board of Trustees on this endeavor.

Thank you to the Nurture Committee who prepared and hosted our luncheon on Consecration Sunday. They created a card with a mustard seed taped to it and this verse from Matthew 17:20 for each place setting:

For truly I tell you if you have faith the size of a mustard seed,

You will say to this mountain, 'Move from here to there,'

And it will move. Nothing will be impossible for you.

May we continue to embody [t]His spirit throughout 2014!

Connecting With ...

EASY (Elida After School Youth) Program

The EASY after school program is off and running and we are having a great time! Opening day was Monday, January 13, 2014. There were six 5th and 6th grade students with one high school student and nine adult volunteers.

The evening went smoothly, even with a bus number change that morning at the middle school. The students arrived at 3:00 and settled in to do A LOT of homework with the adults helping the students (and each other) while having a snack. At 4:00 the schoolwork was put away and the fun started. The students were allowed to choose which group they wanted to attend. Their choices were building a model train set-up, cooking, or a book club with science experiments. The boys chose the train set-up and the girls chose cooking. Both groups learned new skills right off the bat and seemed to have fun doing it. At 5:00 p.m., the train base was started and personal pizzas were ready to eat.

It was fun watching the interactions between the adults and children and the way some of them opened up during the activity time after struggling with schoolwork. Sharing God's Blessings

In February, many people give valentines to their friends and family. Some valentines are funny and some are sweet. They are one way to tell people "you're important to me!"

Jesus doesn't say anything about valentines, but he does tell people that they are important to him, and to God. In Matthew 5 you can read some of Jesus' words of love and encouragement. Sometimes this passage is called the beatitudes, which means "blessed."

Read Matthew 5:1-12 and think about the blessings Jesus talks about. Notice the people who Jesus is blessing. Try writing beatitudes of blessing and encouragement for people you know.

Notes of Blessings

Think of someone who is or has been a particular blessing to you. Make a valentine or a card of appreciation. Tell what the blessing was, the difference it has made in your life, and how it inspires you.

Blessings Fortune Cookies

Surprise someone by tucking words of blessing inside a fortune cookie! Follow the cookie recipe, but before you start, write words of blessing on a small slip of paper (3 x ½-in/7 x 1-cm) or choose something from Matthew 5:1-12.

2 Tbsp/30 mL milk ½ tsp/2.5 mL vanilla

3 Tbsp/45 mL sugar 1/3 c/75 mL all-purpose flour 1 egg white glass muffin tin & cookie sheet

Mix together sugar, egg white, and vanilla. Stir in flour until well blended. Drop rounded teaspoonfuls onto a baking sheet greased with butter and spread into a 3-in/7-cm circle with the back of a spoon. Bake at 400°F for 3-4 minutes until edges are brown. Loosen cookie with a spatula and turn over. Place folded fortune in the center. Quickly fold cookie in half, press edges together for several seconds. Grasp ends of cookie, place center over rim of glass and gently press ends down to bend cookie in the middle. Place each cookie in the muffin cup

to retain shape until cool.
