





2015 Annual Conference

46th Session of the West Ohio Conference

Annual Conference was held Sunday, June 7, through Wednesday, June 10, at Lakeside Chautauqua on Lake Erie. The theme, "Becoming the Beloved Community: Taken, Blessed, Broken and Given" used the third word Broken to shape our direction this year.

After registration Sunday afternoon at South Auditorium, lay members headed to Hoover Auditorium for the laity session where business began after Bishop Gregory V. Palmer convened the Annual Conference and described the tasks, which are to set policy, direction and rules and to elect leaders who will inform the direction and rules of the larger denomination.

On Monday morning following worship the Bishop reconvened the Annual Conference. The three days' events consisted of the following:

- Reports—lots of them
- Fixing of appointments beginning July 1
- Imagine No Malaria Report-- \$3.5 million goal reached and probably surpassed
- Election of 8 lay, 8 clergy and 8 alternates to both General and Jurisdictional Conferences
- Voting on 11 recommendations—10 adopted and 1 tabled
- Special guests and recognitions
- Powerful, joyful and spirit-filled worship
- Honoring retirees
- Remembering those clergy and family members who have passed
- Commissioning 5 provisional deacons and 16 provisional elders
- Ordaining 3 deacons and 21 elders
- Teaching lessons from Dr. Thomas Long, Professor at Candler School of Theology at Emory University in Atlanta (Pastor Paul and I both would like to attend his class.)
- Special lunch meetings with speakers. (I attended the annual Laity Luncheon with speaker Rev. Tony Miltenberger and received his book <u>UnBreakable</u>.)
- Special Events—baptism in Lake Erie, 5 K Run
- Family Fun—movies, crafts, games and worship for kids

Business concluded on Wednesday close to 8 p.m. This was a very long day. To see more details and video presentations visit westohioumc.org/ac/2015/week-review. It was a very busy three and a half days filled with information and inspirational preaching and teaching.

Brad Joseph was a member of Elida St. Paul's United Methodist serving as our youth director, computer technician, a member of the choir, and a participant for many years at the Nuevo Progresso Mexico Medical Mission as a Pharmacist. The **Bradley Joseph Memorial Fund** was established in 2007 shortly after his death. The purpose of the Memorial Fund is to provide scholarships to Pharmacy Students from Ohio or Michigan to go on Medical Mission trips. The fund has funded scholarship winners from Ohio Northern and Findlay Universities who have gone to Kenya, Dominican Republic, Haiti, Uganda, Kenya, Pakistan and Brad's favorite place, Mexico. There is a plaque in Brad's name at the clinic in Nuevo Progresso.

The Memorial Fund has been built up over the years since his death with donations and the proceeds of the **BRADLEY JOSEPH MEMORIAL GOLF OUTING** that is held annually in his name. The assets of the Memorial Fund are held at the Findlay-Hancock County Community Foundation. Crafty Creatures is a group of ladies from St. Paul UMC who have been meeting weekly on Wednesday evening since September, 2010. We enjoy fellowship, fun, food, Bible study, and creating. We are knitters, crocheters and quilters. Our hands are busy making prayer shawls, mittens, gloves, scarves, and lap quilts for our church family, our community, and beyond. We present a prayer shawl or lap quilt to members of our congregation who need special healing. At Christmas time the mittens, scarves, and gloves are placed on the mitten tree in the sanctuary. Throughout the year the lap quilts we make are taken to area nursing homes and given to residents who need a warm quilt.

To date we have donated 281 lap quilts to area nursing homes, 40 prayer shawls and quilts to people who need healing, 68 ambu bags to Sunshine Children's Home in Toledo, and 55 comfort squares to Lima Memorial Hospital Women's Health Center. We very much appreciate everyone who has donated fabric and money to our group's mission and supported our cookie walk in December. We enjoy doing for others!

Pay homage to Old Glory, All you sons and daughters, true, For she represents America And America, we love you!




Freedom under God





After a busy summer day, relax in the shade with this cool drink.




What you need:

- Swedish Fish candy


What you do:



In summer 2003, I received news that my 95-year-old grandmother, a faithful follower of Jesus, had died. Right afterward, my husband and I took our two young girls outside to catch our breath — only to find a special symbol of new life waiting for us.

On the porch railing sat a strange-looking, wriggling lump. Upon closer investigation, we saw a tiger swallowtail emerging from its cocoon — body still plump and wings still wet. Before the huge butterfly tried out its wings and flew away, we had a few moments to take photos of it with our daughters.

We still marvel at the timing. We had named our baby after Grandma, but they hadn't yet met. A stunning creature, sent just when we needed it, reminded us that "baby Carrie" would meet Grandma Carrie someday in heaven, where we'll all be made new.



St. Anne, Grandmother of Jesus

Though never mentioned in the Bible, St. Anne (or Ann) is traditionally known as the mother of Mary and grandmother of Jesus. Her name comes from the Hebrew Hannah, meaning "grace." Legend holds that she believed herself barren until finally, after 20 years of marriage, she gave birth to the baby who would become Jesus' mother. As the story goes, Anne later had two more daughters, Mary Cleopas and Mary Salome, each of whom gave birth to boys who came to be followers of their cousin Jesus: James the Younger and James the Elder, Simon, Jude and John the Evangelist.

Statues and pictures of Anne often show her teaching Mary to read. Others show her with both her oldest daughter and her grandson Jesus. Commemorated on July 26, Anne is considered the patron saint of grandmothers. In some parts of the world, Roman Catholics consider her their grandmother, too.
