



Church History

In the summer, Vacation Bible School was again held at St. Paul's. It was a huge success and a program was presented to the congregation. VBS would not be possible without the tireless help from all of our dedicated volunteers.

Early in 1994, St. Paul's held their first Family "Y" Night at the Lima YMCA. Numerous events and activities, including swimming, volleyball, basketball, and using the track, were open for our parishioners.

In April, Candace Van Horn donated a new Howard grand piano to St. Paul's. This donation was made in memory of her husband, Herbert Paul Van Horn, and her parents, Henry and Hannah Desenberg. A special dedication service was held on April 10, 1994. W.E. Allman, nephew of Candace, and Adrienne Hoghe, great-granddaughter of Candace, played the piano for the congregation.

The Koinonia Chicken Barbeque was held in April. It was deemed a success, thanks to the Koinonia members' hard work, and much cooperation and help from the congregation.

Vacation Bible School was held in August and was very well-attended and successful. God's Family Tree was made on the wall with each child's picture. Weldon LaRue was the storyteller.

The Koinonia Class again had a Halloween party in October, with several members coming in costumes. They are quite an imaginative, creative group.

In 1995 the remodeling of the church office began. Also in January, the Joy Singers helped Lois Cook, their pianist, celebrate her birthday. Many musical "noisemakers" were used.

In April, 1995, our Chancel Choir director, Todd Hanes, became the Elida Schools Superintendent. The choir helped him celebrate with cake and punch after choir rehearsal. The beautiful and delicious cake was made by Myrna Metzger.

A gift given in memory of Gary Cook from the village of Elida was dedicated on June 2, 1995. At the end of the service on that day, everyone moved to the front walk of the church, where three trees had been planted in Gary's honor. The mayor, Robert E. Willet, read a Proclamation and the gift was accepted by the President of the Board of Trustees, Jamie Wyant. Rev. McGlade consecrated the gift with a prayer followed by a responsive prayer read by the congregation.





Kathy White is retiring from Elida Local Schools after 22 years in district volunteer and administrative support positions. She was class treasurer during her four years at Emmaus High School, attended Penn State Allentown campus for one year before graduating from Lehigh County Community College with an Associate Degree in Business Administration. Kathy began her vocational career at Buckeye Pipe Line Company near Allentown, PA (somebody had to open the back door for Marty!) in 1976. She moved to Stanley-Vidmar, Inc., a division of The Stanley Works (tools, etc.), in 1979 before temporarily leaving the employment world upon son Tim's arrival in 1987. Buckeye moved Marty & Family to Lima in 1992. Kathy began her Elida Local Schools career in 1994 as a middle school volunteer followed by lunch-room monitor She became secretary to the District Technology in 1997. Coordinator in 1999 and with added responsibilities became a member of Elida's Central Office staff a few years later. In 2010, Kathy succeeded Sandy Schwartzengraber as secretary to the Principal of E.H.S. Because of SERS retirement plan reform, Kathy has decided 'all good things come to an end' when the EHS Class of 2017 takes a bow June 1.

After 39 years, **Denny Thompson** will retire from his career as a high school teacher this May. He will continue, however, to coach Elida golf and basketball. Because Denny spent his high school days at Elida, leaving the 'office' and hallways of E.H.S. will be a strange and new experience for him. Denny graduated from Elida as president of his class; president of the Honor Society; was a member of the basketball, track and tennis teams; was drum major for the band; and was a choir member to list some of his high school activities and accomplishments. After high school, Denny entered Bluffton College (now University) majoring in math education and continuing his basketball career. His first teaching position was in Montpelier, Ohio. After one year in 'God's County' as the locals called their area, he was anxious to move back to Allen County. Consequently, he took a position at Bath High School which lasted five years. With a yearning to return to Bulldog Country, Denny secured a math teaching position at Elida High School in 1984 and the rest, as they say, is history. 

Summer Flowers


Behold the flowers of June! How fair and bright their buds appear, as, opening to the summer air, our eyes and hearts they cheer!
