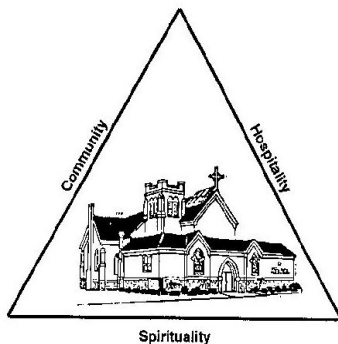

I want to thank everyone who helped out with the Lenten Wilderness Sermon series. Your pictures helped set the tone and inspired us all to seek Christ. Now we are beginning a six week series about second chances. Maybe you are looking for a second chance or you have had a second chance and want to share your experience. We will talk about divorce, mental illness, three moms, prostitution, greed, and finally, about someone who abandoned everything he believed in. Just because you haven't done something that bad doesn't mean you will need a second chance. All of us seek second chances, seek change in our lives, seek forgiveness even though we don't deserve it. We know Jesus is the place we can go for second chances but sometimes we need to be reminded who is the author of second chances.

Things are happening in the mission field: one thing close to home and one thing far away and both are truly amazing opportunities to be about the work of the church. We will continue to do the work we have already been doing, but now we can expand the kingdom through new and exciting ways. If you didn't know it, Habitat for Humanity is close to building a home right here in Elida and I hope we can be one of many organizations that play an important role in building hope for a family who will be our neighbors. The second chance we have is in Mexico, working with a missionary couple who dreams of bringing a neighborhood the gospel through camping ministry. Working with Allentown and possibly Immanuel, we can be one of the founding West Ohio churches who helps this couple repeat what they accomplished at Camp Sierra Linda, which we supported with prayer and money. I want you to be in prayer for these missions and be ready to roll up your sleeves and get to work wherever God leads us.

Well, I have to go get ready to eat chicken at the church chicken BBQ, so I'll see you in the mission field.

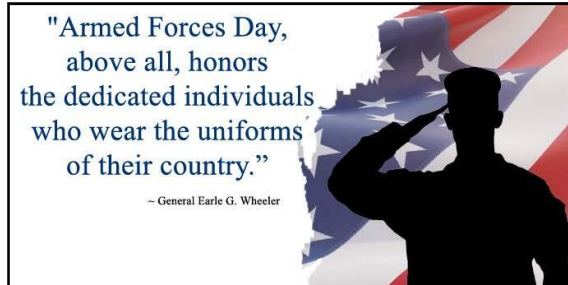

Mission

St. Paul's Missions Projects

The people at St. Paul's church are "on the move" with mission projects. We have some continuing missions, which we have been faithfully supporting and are looking at some new mission projects this year. First, thank-you to the people who worked at ***Our Daily Bread Soup Kitchen*** on March 29th. A small group of people have been very faithful about serving in the soup kitchen, and it is greatly appreciated. Our next Friday to serve at the kitchen is May 31st. A signup sheet will be available in May. Another thank-you to people who faithfully support our food pantry each month. The food collected goes to the ***Five Loaves Food Pantry*** at Allentown church and is distributed to people in need in the 45807 zip code area (Elida). Your faithfulness feeds families!

St. Paul's ***Coins-for-Communion*** offering on the first Sunday of each month has been supported well by our congregation for use in many areas of mission work. In April, the CFC offering went to the ***Five Loaves Food Pantry*** and in May the CFC will go to the United ***Methodist Church Camps*** including Camp Wesley. Thank-you for your faithful giving to the CFC offering. Special offering Sundays are also well supported at St. Paul's church. Our ***Easter offering*** was designated to go to two new mission projects (new to St. Paul's) this year. Half will go to ***Light the Way***, a mission of the West Ohio Conference to develop new faith communities and increase the number of highly vital existing communities throughout west Ohio. The other half of the Easter offering will go to another new mission, ***Mission Possible***, a mission of the Northwest Plains District which supports seven Christian schools, 2200 students and 250 teachers in Haiti and including providing food, child sponsorships and mission trips as well. In 1988 ***Mission Possible*** was expanded to include the Dominican Republic, so both countries are being served.

On May 5th we celebrate ***Native American Ministries Sunday***, a mission of the United Methodist Church, which nurtures mission with Native Americans and provides scholarships for United Methodist Native American seminarians. Special offering envelopes will be available.

Our summer mission's projects include some familiar projects and some that are new. Our ***building of ramps locally*** and support of building a modern cabin at ***Camp Wesley*** in Bellefontaine continues. The cabin project is nearing completion with a few issues that need to be resolved to complete the project. Another project that St. Paul's is looking at is partnering with other churches in Elida to build a ***Habitat For Humanity House in Elida***. A presentation was given to the mission committee by an official of HFH in Lima, which spelled out the project. Both physical work and donations will be needed by our congregation. There will be more information on this project in coming months.

An exciting mission project, which we are looking at is located in ***Haultuco, Mexico***. Support of the ***Camp Sierra Linde*** in Monterrey, Mexico, has been completed by the Northwest Plains District. Two individuals in Mexico who helped with Sierra Linde have moved their mission work to ***Haultuco*** in southern Mexico. Allentown Church has asked our help in supporting this mission to establish churches and camps in this very poor area of Mexico. Monetary support will be needed at first with possibly mission teams in the future. More information will be forthcoming.

The 12th ***Annual Brad Joseph Memorial Golf Outing*** fundraiser is coming up on July 13th. If you would like to golf or be a volunteer helper, watch for notices in the bulletin. Choose a mission project in which you would like to help and come join us be ***Christ's hands and feet!***

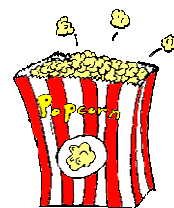

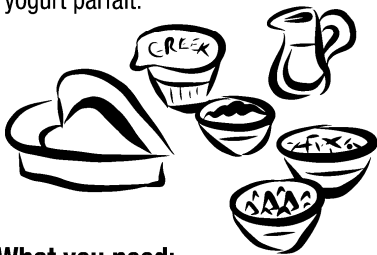

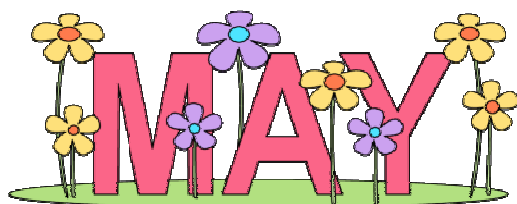

Living Our Faith

Echoes Of Easter

The Resurrection wasn't a "one-off"; it was a spark that lit a flame that continues burning even today, especially where people minister in the Risen One's name. One such outreach, Camp Noah, serves children traumatized by disaster. Nationwide, volunteers offer week-long experiences of kindness, love, listening and safety to kids who've recently survived a tornado, flood, hurricane, wildfire or shooting. Kids often open up for the first time to share their "storm stories" and begin a journey of healing.

Leaders at Camp Noah attest to God's power to bring joy out of sorrow, trust out of fear and life out of death. A boy who initially was aloof dances with another camper at the closing worship; kids who arrived with uncertain expressions leave with smiles and regained confidence. Mental health counselors are part of camp teams, and referrals are made to continue care afterward.

Resurrection often happens in steps, not overnight. But wherever "ordinary" daily ministry takes place in Christ's name, extraordinary echoes of the first Easter are evident.

Floating On Faith

As a man and his young daughter were boating one day, their vessel sprang a leak. The father knew he'd have to swim to shore but couldn't with the child in tow. She hadn't gotten far in swimming lessons but could float on her back, so he told her to do so and promised to return.

Coast Guard personnel were skeptical that a child could survive so long in the water. But hours later, as the sun set and they considered halting the search, someone spied a red dress amid the waves. The girl, still floating, was singing a hymn. Astounded, rescuers asked how she held on so long. "My daddy said he'd come back for me," she said, "and he never breaks his promises."

Prayer rests on just such trust. We can't know when God will answer or act, but we know he promises never to abandon us and that God keeps his promises. So we can lie back and float — on faith.
