



#### ST. PAUL'S JOINS RENEWED FAMILY PROMISE MISSION

Jesus commanded his disciples to go out and proclaim the good news of the Gospel to all the earth and to "feed my sheep" both spiritually and physically. One way to do that is to help families who are struggling to get back on their feet. Family Promise of Lima does just that. Families are housed during the evenings in churches to help

provide food and shelter to families in need while the parents seek work and housing. Once again, St. Paul's church will be involved with Family Promise. We will join six other churches: Allentown, Immanuel, Salem Mennonite, Pike Mennonite, Grace Community and Gomer Congregational to host a family at Immanuel UMC four times a year. Each church will be responsible to provide food and staffing at Immanuel UMC for 4 days out of the year. We will need volunteers to spend time with the families at Immanuel and to provide food from 5:30 PM to 6:30 AM. Immanuel will take care of the first day, a Sunday. The seven churches will meet in January, 2020, to have a planning meeting to organize this effort. Anyone wishing to join Pastor Paul and Tim Piper at this organizational meeting should contact Tim Piper. As we prepare for this important mission, we ask that our congregation pray for guidance and wisdom for the leaders of this mission so that we may extend Christ's love and helping hands to these families. Praise God that the people of St. Paul's are willing to join a new mission field to further God's Kingdom!

#### HABITAT FOR HUMANITY

#### **A BENCH FOR CAPS!**





## Tandykake



Ingredien	ts	Instructions
1 cup	Milk, scalded	Preheat oven to 350 degrees.
2 Tbl.	Butter	Pour scalding milk over butter, let cool. Add remaining ingredients together:
2 cups	Flour	*Mixture will be on the dry, thick side.
2 cups	Sugar	Add the milk mixture. Pour into greased jelly roll pan. Bake for 25 minutes. Top will be slightly brown.
2 tsp.	Baking powder	Remove from oven. While hot, carefully spread peanut
1/2 tsp.	Vanilla	butter over the top. (Peanut butter will begin to melt and be easier to spread as it warms.) Use as much peanut butter as you wish.
4	Eggs	Refrigerate until cold.
	Peanut butter	Melt a large Hershey bar, with rubber spatula spread
7 oz.	Hershey bar	over peanut butter layer. Spread quickly before chocolate begins to harden.

#### A Little Child Will Lead Them

Isaiah 11 prophesies hope for the world: wisdom, understanding, righteousness, justice, faithfulness, peace. In the words "a little child will lead them" (v. 6), Christians hear a foretelling of God's coming to earth as the child Jesus. Today, children — Jesus' examples of fitness for God's kingdom (Mark 10:14) — often lead in showing love.

At age 11, avid baker Michael Platt opened a pastry shop in Maryland to benefit homeless people; for desserts sold, he gives an equal number to shelter residents. Eric Schubert, 18, of New Jersey, uses his genealogy research skills to help strangers more than 1,000 so far — find long-lost family. In Pennsylvania, Neijae Graham-Henries became a certified barber at age 7 to give free haircuts to kids who couldn't afford them. (Stories shared on GoodNewsNetwork.org.)

May these children inspire us to use our passions and skills for good, in the name of the Christ-child, who grew up and taught us to serve others in love.
