



Another month has slipped by and everyone is getting busy. Some of you are working on getting ready for the charge conference on October 11<sup>th</sup>, or the start of the EASY program. But I know all of you are very busy. Thank you for taking a few minutes to keep up with what is happening at church.

EASY is starting back this month and the Elida Area Community Center is expanding the program again this year to include 4 grades and up to 40 kids. They will be meeting in 2 places (St Paul's and Immanuel's) on Mondays and Wednesdays throughout the year. This is a great opportunity for all of us to build relationships in the community and share God's love through our actions.

You will have noticed already that some of the kids in church are helping out on Sunday morning with the liturgy. I'm very proud of each child who bravely stands before you each Sunday and I hope you will let them know how well they did and how brave they are.

Speaking of children, by the end of this month we will be filling shoeboxes for Operation Christmas Child. So keep an eye out all you bargain shoppers for some good sales to fill up your shoebox. Some of you have asked for an example of what to put into a box. I looked at the website and here is what NOT to get: toy guns, knives, or military figures; chocolate or food; out-of-date candy; liquids or lotions; medications or vitamins; breakable items such as snow globes or glass containers; and aerosol cans. Here are some suggestions of what you CAN get: toys, stuffed animals, school supplies, soap, wash clothes, toothbrush, combs, hair bows and brushes, t-shirts, socks, hats, gloves, outfits, sunglasses, jewelry, watches, flashlights (w/ extra batteries), and handmade crafts just to name a few. I hope you will fill a box or maybe 10 boxes with love and good stuff for a child to experience Jesus' love in a Christmas box.

Finally, I am off to prison at the end of the month to participate in AOCI Kairos #2 here at the Lima Prison. If you have any questions about Kairos and what we do just track me down and ask. Thanks to everyone who is making cookies and praying for me, the team and the inmates. And thanks to all of you for letting me go do crazy stuff for God in the name of the church. I will be asking for a few more things over the next few weeks including coloring place mats and making a poster or two. God willing, hearts will be changed and lives will be saved through your efforts. See you around church and in the mission field.


#### **Operation Christmas Child**

Operation Christmas Child, a project of Samaritan's Purse, is the world's largest Christmas outreach of its kind. Since 1993, Operation Christmas Child has delivered gift-filled shoeboxes to over 124 million children affected by war, poverty, natural disasters, and other crises in more than 150 countries and territories. 

#### **Faith Statement**


I believe in the God of fruit time and harvest. who makes the land to bear gifts in its time and fills our tables with the bounty of his hand;



St. Paul's UMC held its first Fun Festival on a Saturday in October, 1989.




