


500 hot dogs, chips and bags of popcorn were handed out to our community as they wondered around the Field House parking lot enjoying the fun and fellowship.

Elida After School Youth Program

The Elida After School Program (E.A.S.Y) is a program where we have the opportunity to make disciples for Christ. BUT: not through preaching or Sunday school classes or even bible studies.

At E.A.S.Y we have the chance to support, encourage and teach basic knowledge with kids in grades five through eighth. In this program, volunteers provide an after school snack, help and support students with homework and teach them new skills. Skills such as art, sewing, cooking, carpentry, science, working together as a group and many more.

Does this work? Yes! By developing relationships with the kids we have had the privilege of watching students grow in confidence, skills and improve their grades. We even have students who have returned to us in high school to become volunteers.

How does this program create disciples? Instead of teaching and preaching this program shows Christ's love through action. We plant the seed, water it and pray for its growth.

If you are interested in being part of this action, here are some suggestions:

- 1. Come volunteer on Mondays and Wednesdays starting in October. DON'T say, "I don't know how to do the homework these kids get." Neither do many of us, but God has blessed us with those who can explain it.
- 2. Offer to teach your hobby to a group of kids.
- 3. Offer to purchase, cook, and bring in a light meal for one week, (Monday and Wednesday), and serve it to the students. We have the light meal plans already; all you have to do is the put the plan into action.

They stayed in a hotel and had great family time with snacks and activities, such as playing games, cards, etc. In April they had another successful Chicken BBQ, which raised money to help with projects at the church.






These healthy chips make a yummy back-to-school snack.

- 3. Bake at 200 degrees for two to three hours, until chips are dry but still slightly soft.

Living Our Faith

God's Left Hand

A 6-year-old and his grandma went for a walk one autumn day. "Look at the gorgeous leaves!" Grandma exclaimed. "Just think, God painted each one of them just for us!"

"Yep," said her grandson, "and he did it left-handed."

Perplexed, Grandma asked, "Why do you think God used his left hand to create all this beauty?"

"Because," said the boy matterof-factly, "we learned in Sunday school that Jesus sits on God's right one."

A Taste of Heaven

When an admirer asked renowned pianist Vladmir Horowitz how he could play so beautifully, he's said to have replied that anyone could play the notes, but the true music lay in the pauses between them. The same can be said of life.

Rabbi Evan Moffic (*Shalom for the Heart*) writes, "It is in the pauses — the rests, the spaces in between — that meaning is made and that holiness is felt." Nowadays we keep so busy there's hardly a pause or space in our day.

"But that's not the way God created us [or] the world," Moffic continues. "God worked, then rested. God created, then paused. ... Thus, our Sabbath is the day when we can marvel at the beauty of the world God created. It is the day we enjoy what the ancient sages called 'a taste of heaven.' It is a day when we stop thinking about the *what* of life and remind ourselves of the *why* of life."
