



Business of the Church

As sure as the sun rises and sets every day, so comes our annual Stewardship season at St. Paul's. Stewardship at St. Paul's is interpreted differently by each of us making this aspect of behavior a personal choice involving our relationship with God. It's how we live our lives and how we define and implement accountability and responsibility with our family, with our work associates, with our neighbors and community members, with our habits of spirituality and generosity.

We see many forms of stewardship in action at St. Paul's:

- We tend to the integrity of God's house by fixing, improving, modifying, and maintaining our buildings and grounds;
- We invest in Christian education as evidenced by our renewed curriculum beginning October 27 for children and adults:
- We worship in song and liturgy through the time and talents offered by our choir, by our musicians, and by our Worship Committee;
- We reach out to our neighbors, to our community, to our nation, and to the world through the efforts and initiatives of our Missions Committee:
- We celebrate one another and our community through events prepared by our Nurture Committee, by our ReFocus Seniors Group, and by our ReFocus Youth Center initiative.

St. Paul's Mission Statement is 'An Inviting Community of Christ's Disciples.' Stewardship is discipleship in action! In addition to spirituality, it is the habit of giving to God our time, our talents, and our tithe. The day will come when God asks, 'What have you done with all I've given you?' How will you respond?

During the five Sundays of Stewardship season 2013 beginning October 27, Pastor Paul will be examining the 'Five Pillars of Methodism':

October 27 – 'Passionate Worship'

November 3 – 'Radical Hospitality'

November 10 – 'Intentional Faith Development'

These pillars help support stewardship in our faith community we call St. Paul's U.M.C. We act upon our faith and act as good stewards by the examples we set for ourselves and for our community (five such examples are listed above.) We also energize our stewardship responsibility by asking the question, 'What does God need us to do at this time and in this place'.....and then act upon the answers to this question.

In his 'Extravagant Generosity' message, Pastor Paul will highlight and describe what a community of good stewards looks like: 'Fruitful congregations thrive because of extraordinary sharing, willing sacrifice, and joyous giving out of love for God and neighbor.' St. Paul's has embodied this spirit and activity of fruitful giving but there are ways to do our best better. Please join us this Stewardship season to learn of ways you can energize and improve your habits of generosity in meeting the needs of St. Paul's and our community in gratitude to God.


The mountain moved from here to there!

All Saints



November 1 is All Saints' Day, a time when we remember and celebrate people we think of as saints. Some saints live among us. They may be friends, teachers, and family. Other saints lived and died long ago. Saints are people God has put into our lives to be our friends in the faith - people who support and guide us. They show us a way to God that we do not have to walk by ourselves.

All Saints' Sunday is a day when the church admits that we do not come to faith on our own; someone had to teach us about Jesus, someone had to tell us the story. All that we have as Christians we have as grace, an inheritance we have received from and shared with the saints.

If you think for a moment, you can probably name some people in your family or in your church who you think of as saints. These are people who have been there for you, no matter what. They are people you go to when you have questions. They are people you are happy to share your life with, and people you want to pattern your life after.

We can also be friends with saints who lived long ago. Saint Francis of Assisi is one example.

He took joy in God's creation. His life began in a rich Italian family over 800 years ago. He enjoyed his life with fine clothes and expensive foods, until he was taken captive by enemies. He spent a year in prison and became sick while he was there.

When Francis left prison he saw a poor man with leprosy and that moment changed his life. He gave away what he had and started to care for people who were sick. He remembered what it was like to be sick and alone in a jail cell and he wanted to help others in need.

With God's encouragement, Francis found 12 followers who joined him in his work. They gave away all that they had, lived simple lives, and cheerfully cared for all of God's creation - animals as well as people. You may have seen pictures of Francis with birds, but once he made friends with a wolf too! He loved the great outdoors. They traveled from place to place, country to country, helping the people they met. God, and the people they helped took good care of them.

- Try to imagine what it was like for Francis to be shut up in a prison for a whole year. What do you think prison is like? Can you go wherever you want? Can you do anything you want?
- What do you think Francis would say about Jesus' words: "Do to others as you would have them do to you" (Luke 6:31)?
- Why do you think Francis cared so much for animals and creation?
- I wonder what advice Francis would give us today.

Living by the Golden Rule

In Matthew 7:12 you can read these words: "In everything do to others as you would have them do to you." This is sometimes called the golden rule, and it is a good description of how saints choose to live. Different versions of this teaching are found in other books of the Bible: Matthew 22:39b; Luke 6:31; and Romans 13:8, 9b. Read them and then try writing your own version of the golden rule. Why do you think this rule is "golden"?

Where thoughts turned to home and life seemed so dear.


Now try to imagine how they face the past; How they long for the time those thoughts are gone at last. Then say a little prayer that soon these men may find A place where those memories are left behind.


